Mendota Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation on Vickers Road and Eastside Drive

Expected Start Date: December 2019

Expected End Date: October 2020

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Mendota sanitary trunk sewer (STS) on Vickers Road and Eastside Drive. The sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from sewers and delivers it to wastewater facilities for treatment.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of these trunk sewer sections by approximately 50 years.

WORK DETAILS







The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Majority of the work is taking place in the City streets and under the railway tracks.

- Install temporary pumps and pipes to divert flow from the sewer so that it can be repaired from the inside.
- Reline the existing pipes using a trenchless method.

- A sock filled with resin will be inserted into the sewer pipe through maintenance holes and the sock is then cured with steam forming a new pipe inside the old sewer.
- Rehabilitate the maintenance holes.
- Restore areas affected by construction.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable to ensure they are not affected by the work.
- You may experience dust, noise, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work starts. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Managers listed below.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. When the sock liner is curing, it takes 8-10 hours once initiated. There may be temporary sewer bypass operations and construction activity may in extended hours at times.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level access to driveway, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: The Contractor will survey and photograph all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. The survey will include an inspection of both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Inspection staff will wear photo identification and carry photographic equipment during the survey.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Local roads may be impacted when materials and machinery are being brought into the work areas.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored when construction is complete.</p>
