# Basement Flooding Protection Program on St. Clair Avenue East and Glenwood Crescent

Contract: 18ECS-LU-04FP Winter Shutdown Start Date: December 20, 2019 Winter Shutdown End Date: March 30, 2020 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City's contractor has recently completed sewer upgrades and water service replacements on Glenwood Crescent between Glenwood Terrace and Stag Hill Drive. Since this project started in spring 2019, the City's contractor has completed the following work:

- Storm and sanitary sewer upgrades on St. Clair Avenue East;
- Storm sewer upgrades, and substandard water service replacements on Glenwood Crescent between Glen Gannon Drive and Rexleigh; and
- Storm sewer box culvert installation, watermain, sanitary sewer, sewer lateral and water service replacements on Glenwood Crescent between Glenwood Terrace and Stag Hill Drive.


Before the winter shutdown (end of the week of December 16) the contractor will:

- Remove equipment and materials from the roadway and sidewalks;
- Temporarily pave the road and sidewalks on Glenwood Crescent from Glenwood Terrace to Stag Hill; and
- Temporarily pave the road on Glenwood Crescent from Glen Gannon Drive to Rexleigh Drive.

The paving work is weather dependent and expected to be completed in one day.

Thank you for your patience during construction. We wish you a safe and happy holiday season, and will provide an update before work resumes in April 2020. <u>We are pleased to announce that after</u> paving is completed, Glenwood Crescent will re-open to through traffic from O'Connor Drive, and regular parking restrictions will be in effect.

## UTILITY CONTACTS

During the winter shutdown, utility companies may continue to perform service work along Glenwood Crescent. Below are the contact numbers for the utilities companies that may be in the area.

#### Toronto Hydro:

To ensure a safer work environment when construction resumes in April 2020, the contractor is planning to meet with Toronto Hydro in the New Year to discuss options for working around hydro lines. Toronto Hydro may do some work during the shutdown if they decide that it is required. Please note that Toronto Hydro would determine the timing. If you experience any hydro difficulties, please contact Toronto Hydro's customer service line at 416-542-8000.

#### **Bell/Rogers:**

Bell and Rogers may return to the site at some point during the next few months to adjust some of their overhead lines. Please note that Bell/Rogers will determine the timing. If you experience any service disruptions or any other issues related to Rogers or Bell, please contact your provider at the number listed below:

No.	Winter Maintenance: The contractor will continue to apply salt to sidewalks, and plow any snow (exceeding 5 centimeters) until paving and restoration has been completed up to December 20. After paving, regular snow removal maintenance will resume, and residents on Glenwood Crescent will be expected to maintain their own snow removal on their driveways and walkways, as usual.
P	<b>Driveway Access During Paving:</b> Residents on the sections of Glenwood Crescent between Glenwood Terrace and Stag Hill, and between Glen Gannon Drive and Rexleigh Drive, will have no access to their driveways during paving and are asked to park their vehicles outside of these areas during the evening of <b>Tuesday December 17</b> <sup>th</sup> to ensure paving activities can start at <b>7 a.m. on Wednesday December 18</b> <sup>th</sup> . Vehicular access will be restored at the end of the day once paving is complete.
	<b>Materials/Equipment:</b> Most materials and equipment will be removed from the roadway. Two traffic control barrels around the construction trailer on St. Columba Place will remain. The trailer will have Jersey barriers surrounding it to protect it from snow plows over the winter and will remain in its location during the winter months.
	<b>Excavator:</b> The large excavator is in its storage location on the south side of the street at Glenwood Terrace. The fencing along the traffic island will be pulled approximately 1 meter from the curb into the island for better visibility, and only a small amount of material, i.e. catch basins and some concrete pipe will remain within the fenced area on the island over the winter break.
