Road Resurfacing on Queen's Plate Drive North of Rexdale Boulevard and Intersection Improvements at Highway 27

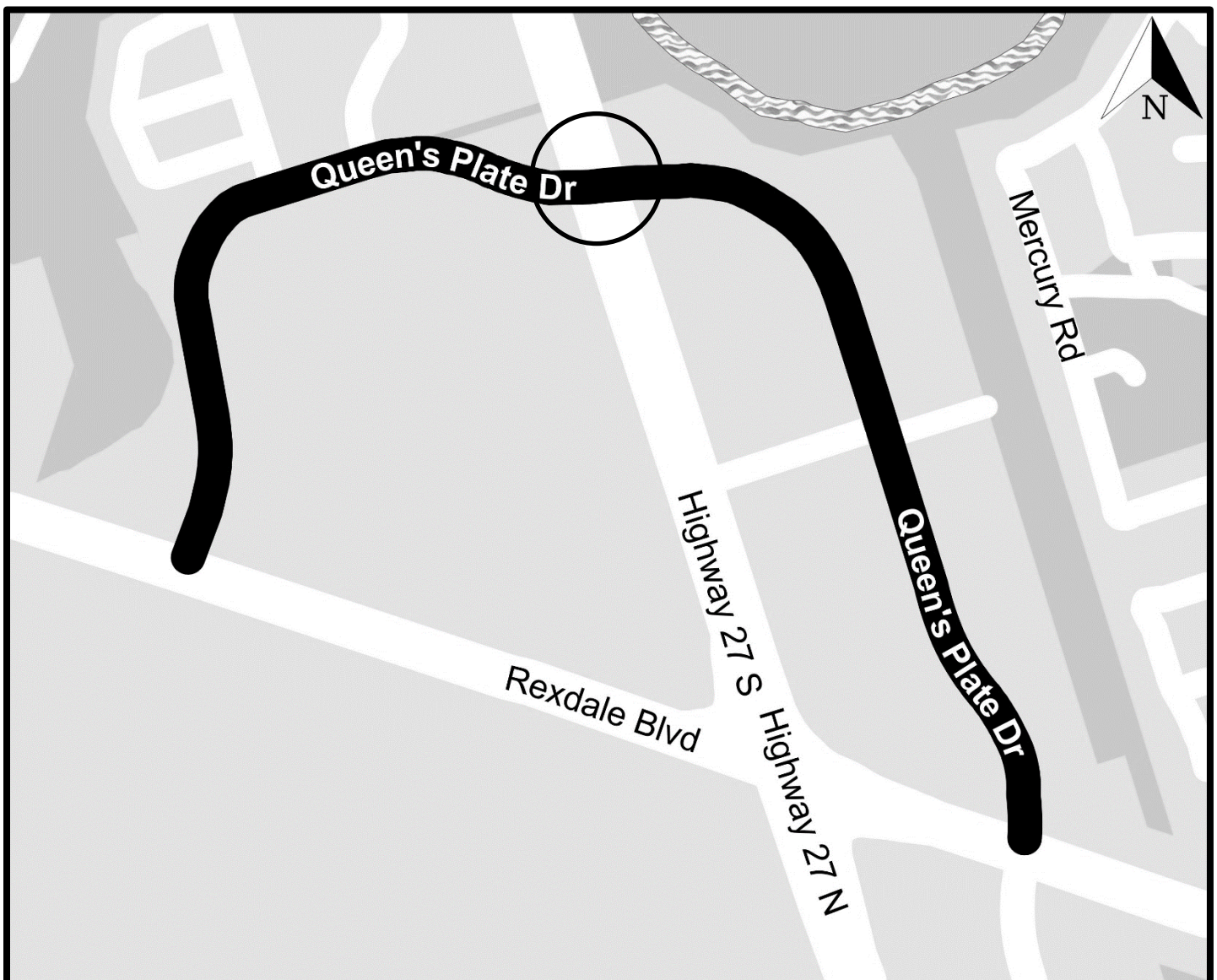

The City of Toronto plans to resurface the road on Queen's Plate Drive north of Rexdale Boulevard and improve the intersection of Highway 27 and Queen's Plate Drive. The intersection will be improved by modifying lanes and traffic signals, reducing turn radiuses and installing new tactile walking surface indicators which will result in better traffic flow and improved pedestrian access and safety. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.



This work is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads, sidewalk and traffic signal improvement for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- Work in the boulevard in front of homes and commercial properties is expected. This work includes removing and replacing driveways, municipal sidewalks and grassed boulevards, where necessary.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways.
