## Dorset Park Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation from West of Kennedy Road to Midwest Road

Expected Start Date: April 2020 Expected End Date: July 2021

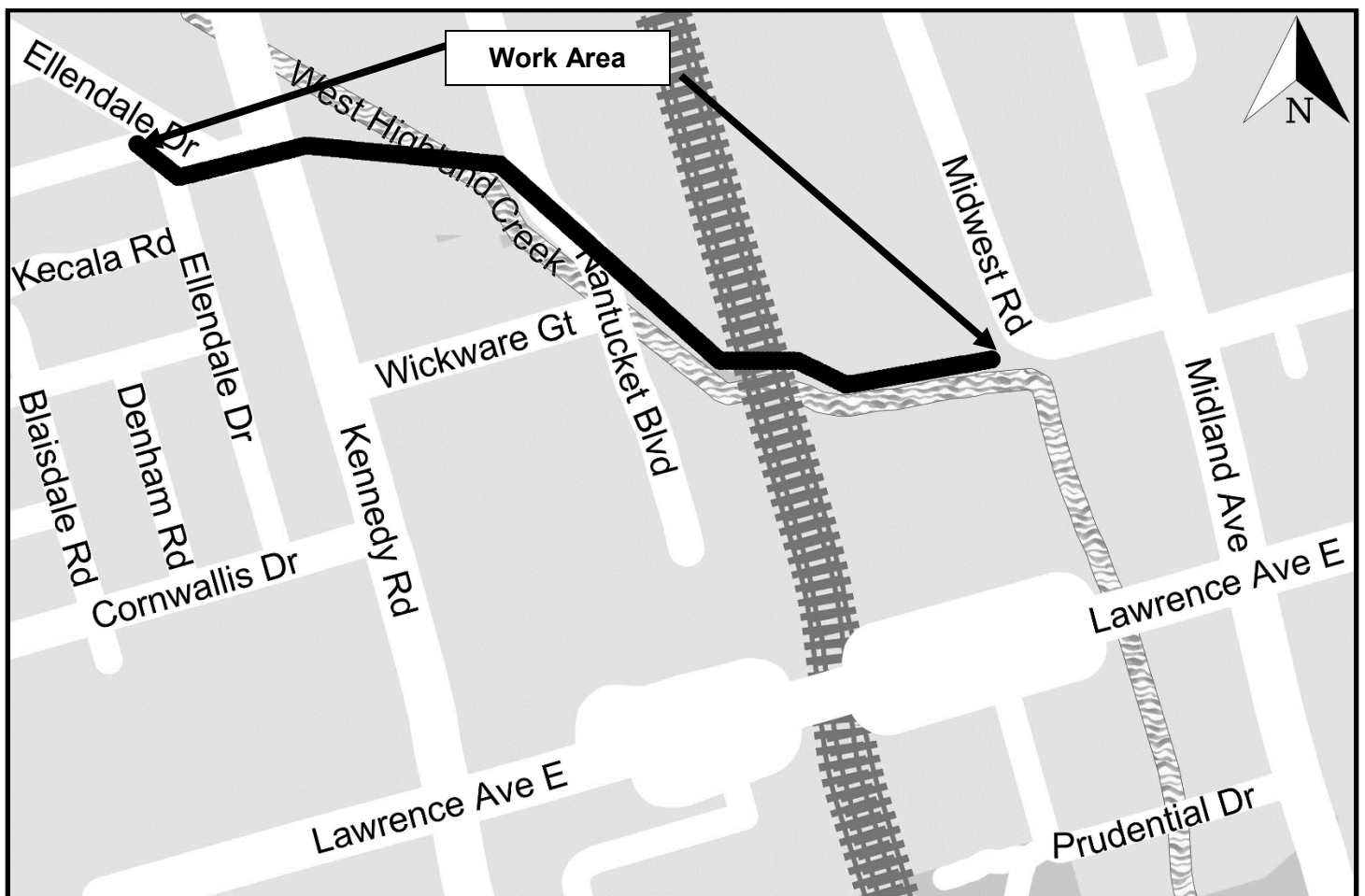

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate the Dorset Park Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS). The Dorset Park STS is located north of Lawrence Avenue, between Kennedy Road and Midwest Road, next to the Dorset Branch of the West Highland Creek ravine.

The sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from sewers and delivers it to wastewater plant for treatment.

Toronto Water has prioritized this repair work due to corrosion and other defects in the sewers. This project is part of the Council-Approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of the rehabilitated sewer sections by 50 years.

### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Before construction starts in April 2020, a construction notice will be provided to area residents and businesses providing more precise information regarding the construction duration and specific closures.
- Work crews will mark underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable to ensure they are not affected by the work.

- Majority of this work will occur within the Right of Way, City Parks and Toronto Region and Conservation Authority lands.
- A portion of the sewer passes Kennedy Rd. and several maintenance holes are located near businesses at 80 Midwest Road.
- Parking alternatives will be provided for affected spots during construction as needed.
- There will be construction activity in the business park at 80 Midwest Road for a few months. An impact to area permits and use is not anticipated, construction fence will be installed to separate the construction work from business activities.

	<p><b>Access to Your Home:</b> The City-hired contractor may need access to your home to complete a pre-construction survey. Affected properties will receive a pre-construction survey request to schedule a time to complete the survey.</p>
	<p><b>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features.</b> Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the <b>Project Manager</b> listed below.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the <b>Project Manager</b> to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
