This week is Police Week in Ontario.

Since 1970, we have taken pause during this week to thank & acknowledge our police officers for their dedicated service. On behalf of all of us, I would like to thank Chief Saunders and each of the women and men of the Toronto Police Service for all that they do to keep us safe each day.

Today, as you know, curbside pick-up for retailers was launched across the City.

The EOC, working with Toronto Public Health and local BIAs, developed guidelines to help ensure public and employee safety. These are available on Toronto.ca/COVID-19 for anyone who would like to access them.

This is new for everyone, and I want to thank the public and businesses for their cooperation and understanding as we work through all of this. We are monitoring and adapting where necessary.

As more parts of the city slowly begin to reopen, whatever the model, the EOC will help ensure we are in a strong position to implement a plan that best fits Toronto's needs. We can learn from other jurisdictions, but each is, of course, unique, so Toronto will build on the learnings of others.

We will continue to create our own plans – each under the guidelines of Toronto Public Health.

We know that the TTC, Solid Waste, Toronto Water, Shelters, Long-Term Care homes, and first responders have continued to meet the needs of the city.

But there are others within the City family that work behind-the-scenes to ensure we function efficiently and effectively.
