West Don Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation from Old York Mills Road to the Don Valley Golf Course

Start Date: January 2019

End Date (Permanent Road and Sod Restoration): June 2020

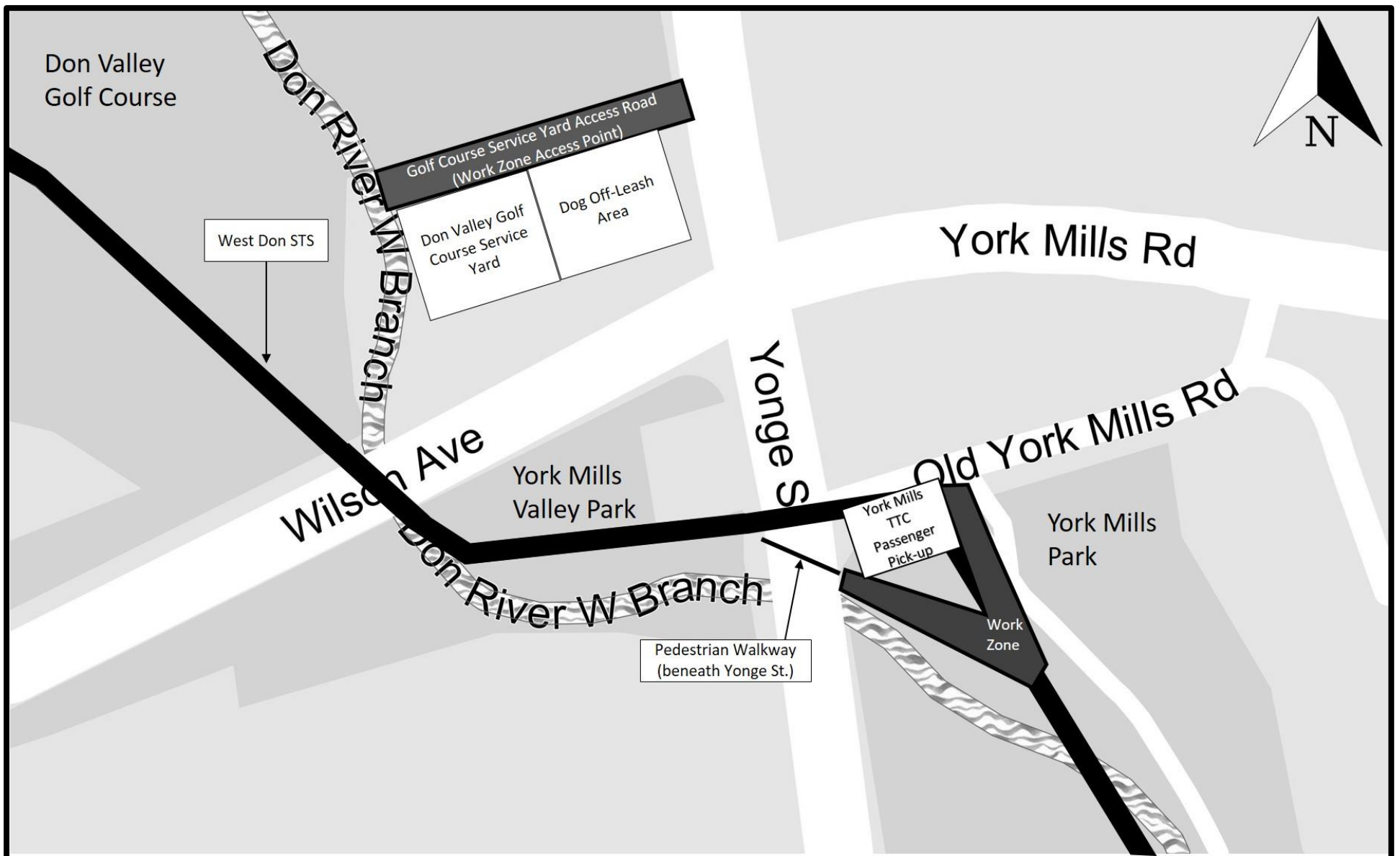
This notice provides an update on the work the City is doing to rehabilitate the West Don Sanitary Trunk Sewer and its maintenance holes from Old York Mills Road (near the York Mills TTC Subway Passenger Pick-Up building) to the Don Valley Golf Course.

All of the sewer and maintenance hole rehabilitation work was completed last year. Due to cold weather, the contractor completed temporary road restoration on Old York Mills Road and demobilized from site in January 2020. The contractor will now return the last week of April 2020 to complete the permanent road restoration and restoration within the Don Valley Golf Course and surrounding ravine areas in York Mills Valley Park, pedestrian walkway beneath Yonge Street, and York Mills Park adjacent to the TTC Passenger Pick-Up building. The contractor will permanently restore the sidewalk, road, curb and sodded areas affected by construction. Trees and shrubs will be planted in the ravine area and all other natural areas will be seeded.







IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

The Province of Ontario has enacted a declaration of emergency to help contain the spread of COVID-19 and protect the public. A list of essential workplaces in Ontario was announced on March 23 and revised on April 3. As indicated on the list, City-led infrastructure construction has been deemed essential and this project will proceed. This construction is essential to ensure the City's infrastructure remain safe, in a state of good repair and able to meet Toronto's needs. WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. No overnight work is expected during the restoration phase.</p>
	<p>Post-Construction Inspection: The contractor will survey and photograph all properties within 30 metres of the construction area for residents who agreed to have pre-condition inspection completed as the start of the project. Participation is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. Due to COVID-19, the post-construction survey will only include an exterior inspection of all properties to verify existing conditions. The contractor will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up survey appointments. Inspection staff will wear photo identification and carry photographic equipment during the survey.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre- and post-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p>Partial Park / Trail Closure: The pedestrian walkway beneath Yonge Street located south of Old York Mills Road will be closed for the duration of the restoration phase due to public safety.</p> <p>The trail through York Mills Park will remain open with a minor detour for a short section. Signage is installed at the access points for the pedestrian walkway beneath Yonge Street and in York Mills Park to help pedestrians navigate through the detour.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
