Dorset Park Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation near West Highland Creek

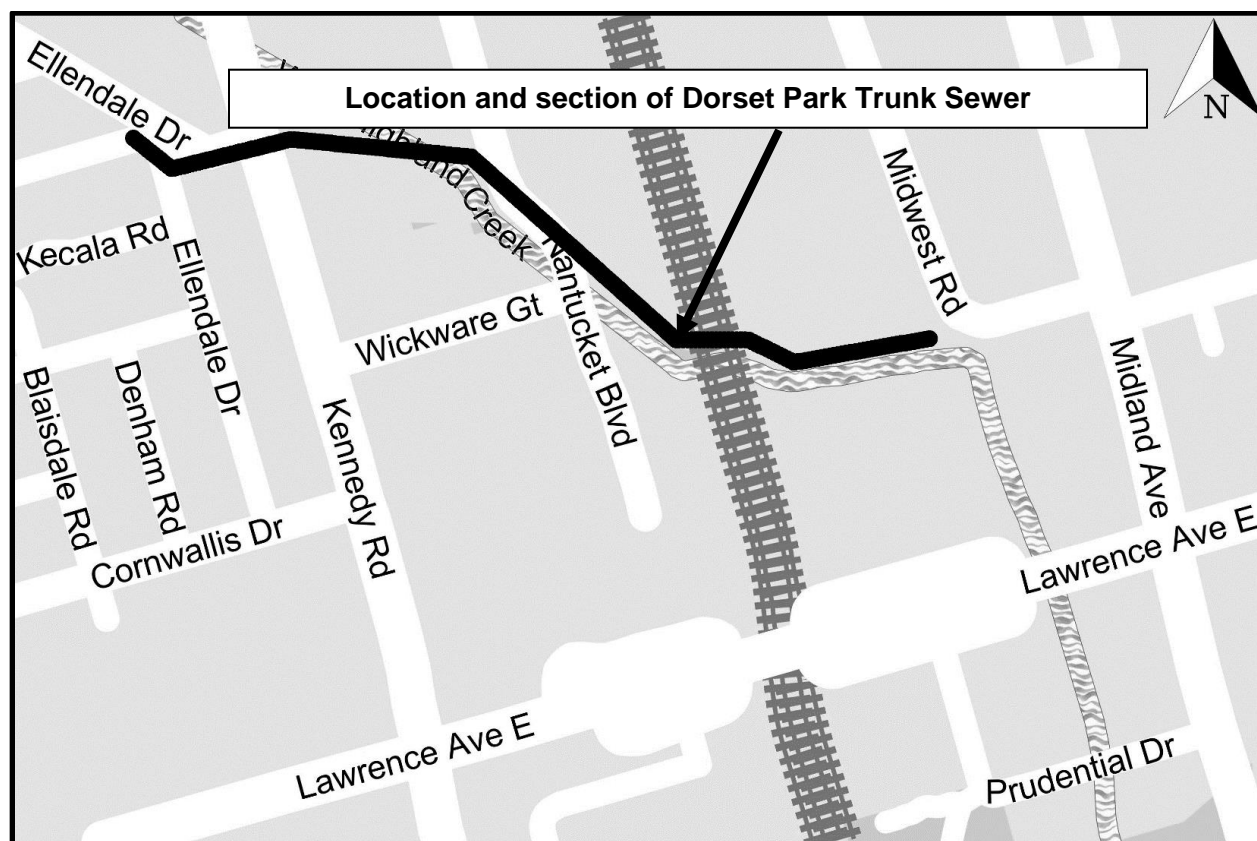

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the Dorset Park Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS). The Dorset Park STS is located north of Lawrence Avenue East between East of Nantucket Boulevard, and West of Kennedy Road and Forbes Road in the Dorset Park area, and next to West Highland Creek.

The Dorset Park STS is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from various streets and sends it to the Wastewater Treatment Plant located near Lake Ontario.

This project is part of the Council-Approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of this trunk sewer section by approximately 50 years.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

The Province of Ontario has enacted a declaration of emergency to help contain the spread of COVID-19 and protect the public. A list of essential workplaces in Ontario was announced on March 23. As indicated on the list, City-led infrastructure construction has been deemed essential and this project will proceed. This construction is essential to ensure the City's infrastructure remains safe, in a state of good repair and able to meet Toronto's needs. WORK DETAILS









The project site is located within Toronto Region and Conservation Authority (TRCA) lands and Ravine and Natural Features Protected Areas (RNFP) and the City Right of Way. The City's contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Work will take place within east of Nantucket Boulevard, and west of the intersection of Kennedy Road and Forbes Road in the Dorset Park area close to the West Highland Creek watercourse.

The Contractor will:

- Install traffic management;
- Install temporary bypass pumps and pipes to maintain sewer service during sewer lining;
- Rehabilitate the mainline sewer pipe. The sewer will be lined using a trenchless relining method. In relining, a sock filled with resin is inserted into the sewer pipe through an existing maintenance hole, and the sock is then cured with steam. Once cured, a new pipe is formed inside the existing pipe;
- Rehabilitate and replace maintenance holes;
- Remove temporary access areas and construction vehicles and equipment from site; and
- Restore areas affected by construction. Since restoration work requires warm weather it will occur in spring/summer 2021.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, trail closures, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property, within the right-of-way or easement areas.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. However, the curing of the sock liner takes 8 to 10 hours once initiated. As such, the temporary sewer bypass and construction activity may continue outside regular working hours.</p>
	<p>Sewer and Water Service Disruptions for Residents: There will be no water and wastewater services disruption anticipated during construction.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: There will be no impact to driveways. Residents who require accommodation (level access to driveway, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: The contractor will survey and photograph all private properties and business-owned facilities within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. The survey will include an inspection of the exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Refer to Condition Survey/Inspection notice for more details.</p> <p>The contractor will deliver a separate notice requesting a time to set up survey appointments. Inspection staff will wear photo identification and carry photographic equipment during the survey.</p>
	<p>Tree Removals: Due to the nature of this project, the City's contractor will have to remove 14 trees along the path of the sewer to facilitate construction work and to create the needed access to the sewer maintenance holes. Efforts have been made to ensure as few trees as possible are removed.</p> <p>A restoration plan approved by the City's Parks Forestry & Recreation Services and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority will be implemented which includes planting up to 97 trees, 760 shrubs and seeding to naturalize the area when construction is complete.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management:</p> <p>There will be some local road closures/impacts. See below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Traffic management on both sides of the intersection of Kennedy Road and Forbes Road. The access road to Kennedy Road through Forbes Road and Ellendale Drive will be closed on both ways. Access to Kennedy Road will be maintained via Ellendale Drive and to Cornwallis Drive. • Traffic management and closures on Forbes Road between Ellendale Drive and Kennedy Road. Access to Kennedy Road will be maintained via Ellendale Drive. • Traffic management on Ellendale Drive and Forbes Road between Kennedy Road and Blaisdale Road. The road will be closed between Ellendale Drive and Forbes Road during this stage. Access to Kennedy Road will be maintained via Forbes Road. • Traffic management and closures on Ellendale Drive between Merryfield Drive and Forbes Road. The closure will be on Forbes Road between Ellendale Drive and Kennedy Road. There will also be another closure on Ellendale Drive between Kecala Road and Forbes Road. Access to Kennedy Road will be maintained via Merryfield Drive, Blaisdale Drive and Forbes Road. • Traffic management and road center alignment on Kennedy Road between south of Cornwallis Drive to the north of Shropshire Drive. One lane in both direction of Kennedy Road will be open to traffic. • Traffic management on Nantucket Boulevard and Wickware Gate between Wickware Gate and approximately 200 m north of Nantucket Boulevard. One lane of traffic will be maintained and directed by flag persons. <p>There will be a short duration impact during construction work in the nearby parking lots. This work will occur over a weekend and extended hours to minimize traffic disruption, and alternative access to parking lots will be available.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored when construction is complete.</p>
