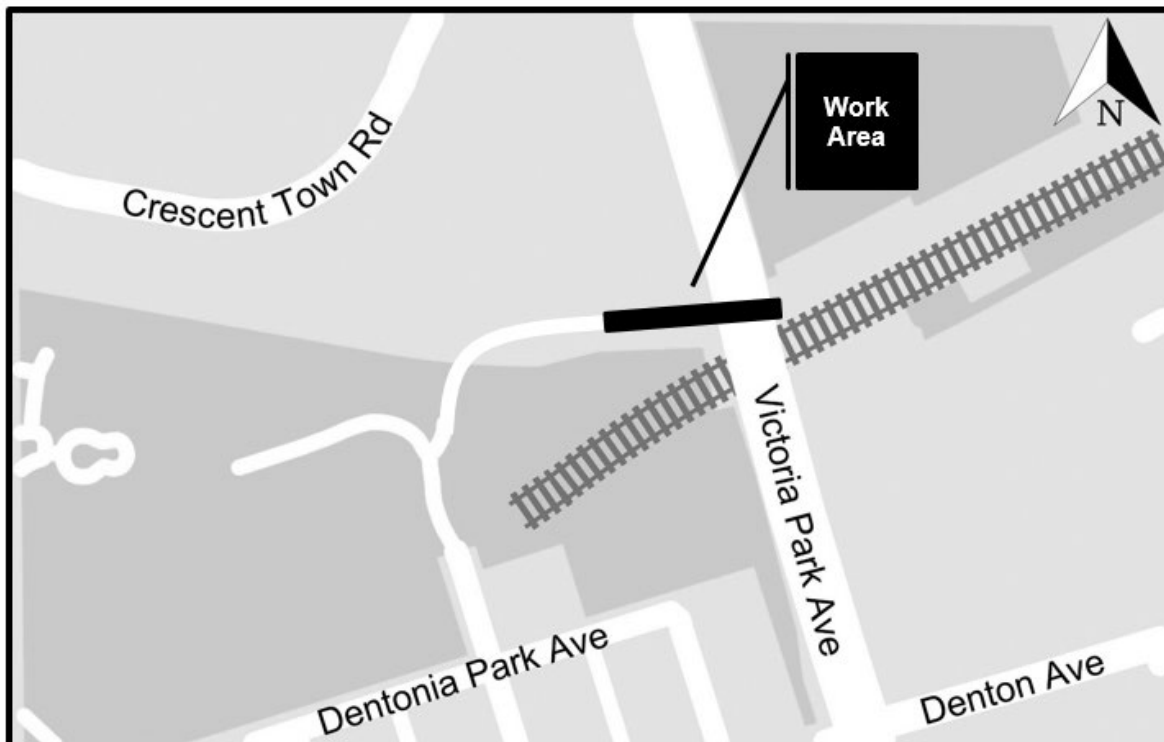

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

The Province of Ontario has enacted a declaration of emergency to help contain the spread of COVID-19 and protect the public. A list of essential workplaces in Ontario was announced on March 23 and revised April 3. As indicated on the list, City-led infrastructure construction has been deemed essential and this project will proceed. This construction is essential to ensure the City's infrastructure remain safe, in a state of good repair and able to meet Toronto's needs. The City's contractor will:

- Repair and refurbish the existing Crescent Town Pedestrian bridge

- Install louver panels between the windows and columns to prevent rain from entering the bridge
- Replace roofing
- Install a non-slip floor sealant

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

|  | <p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p> <p>Overnight Work: There will be 10 to 12 overnight work shifts between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. as approved by the City. Notice will be provided in advance.</p> |
|  | <p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Sidewalks will remain accessible.</p> <p>Pedestrian Bridge: A full closure of the bridge will be required in May to complete the rehabilitation work for a period of approximately 8 weeks. An update with more information will be provided prior to the bridge closure.</p> |
|  | <p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p> |
|  | <p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored.</p> |
