	<b>Work Hours</b> : Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	<b>Overnight Work:</b> There will be 10 to 12 twelve overnight work shifts between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. as approved by the City. Notice will be provided in advance.
÷	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times. Sidewalks will remain accessible.
	Pedestrian Bridge: A full closure of the bridge will be required in May to complete the rehabilitation work for a period of approximately 8 weeks. An update with more information will be provided prior to the bridge closure.
Ė	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (longer notice, etc.) must contact the <b>Project Manager</b> to arrange for access during the construction period.
	<b>Restoration:</b> Areas affected by construction will be restored.
