Pumping Station replacement at Dorset Road and Kingston Road

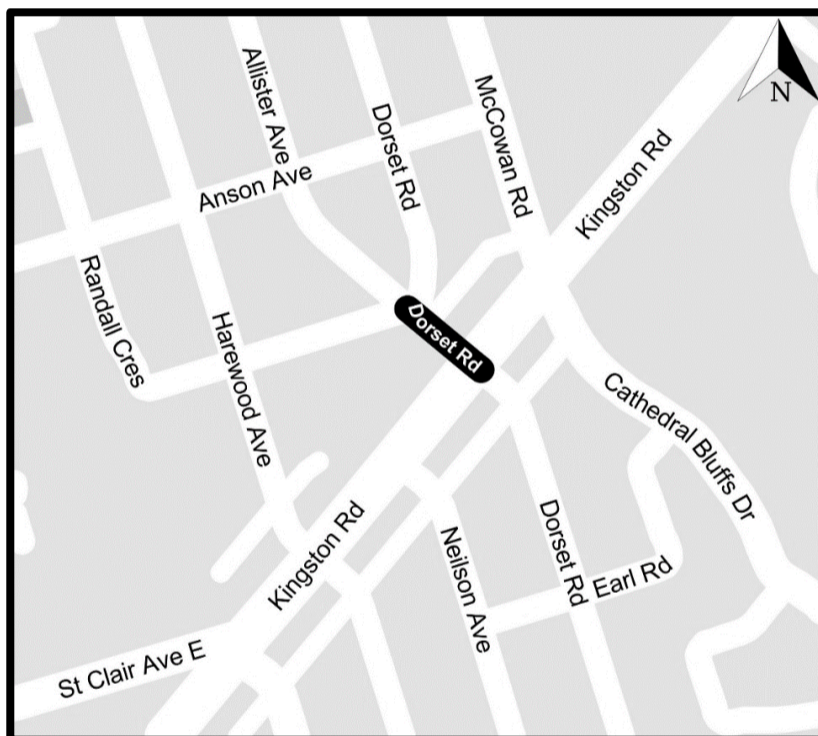

The City of Toronto is replacing the underground Potable Water Pumping Station located in the boulevard on the northwest corner of Dorset Road and Kingston Road.

The Pumping Station was built in the 1970's to pump water to the eastern parts of Toronto. The work we plan to complete will ensure the City continues to deliver water safely and efficiently.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program that will improve water distribution and the City's aging infrastructure.

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Excavate in the boulevard and Dorset Road to remove and demolish the existing underground potable water pump station
- Remove and replace a section of the storm sewer on Dorset Road
- Deliver a new prefabricated pump station to the site
- Install the new pump station underground and tie-in to existing system
- Install a new above ground electrical control panel in the boulevard
- Restore all areas affected by construction

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard), such as landscaping and / or decorative objects. If you have a sprinkler system within the boulevard, please contact the Project Manager.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Water Service Disruptions: The water supply to your property may need to be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advanced notice, an emergency water shut off could have been necessary.</p>
	<p>Road Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access.</p>
	<p>Pedestrian Access: Pedestrian Access will be available on the east side of the work zone.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p>Dorset Road will be closed to through traffic between Kingston Road and Randall Crescent. Local Access to affected driveways will be provided.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored</p>
