Road Resurfacing on Rathburn Road from east of The East Mall to west of Martin Grove Road

Contract: 20ECS-TI-19MR

Expected Start Date: Mid-June 2020 Expected End Date: Early-August 2020

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will resurface Rathburn Road from 122 m east of The East Mall to 70m west of Martin Grove Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it requires repaving in order to extend its lifecycle and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. The City will not resurface the intersection of Rathburn Road and Martin Grove Road, which is planned to be completed as part of a future project on Martin Grove Road.

To support road user safety, vehicle lane widths will be reduced on Rathburn Road using a painted buffer that will be added on the existing bicycles lanes. Future consultation with the community will take place to discuss features for the cycle lane on Rathburn Road. There will be no change to the number of motor vehicle lanes.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. 

WORK DETAILS

- Dig up the road surface
- Re-align maintenance holes and catch basins
- Repair curbs and gutters
- Repave the road surface

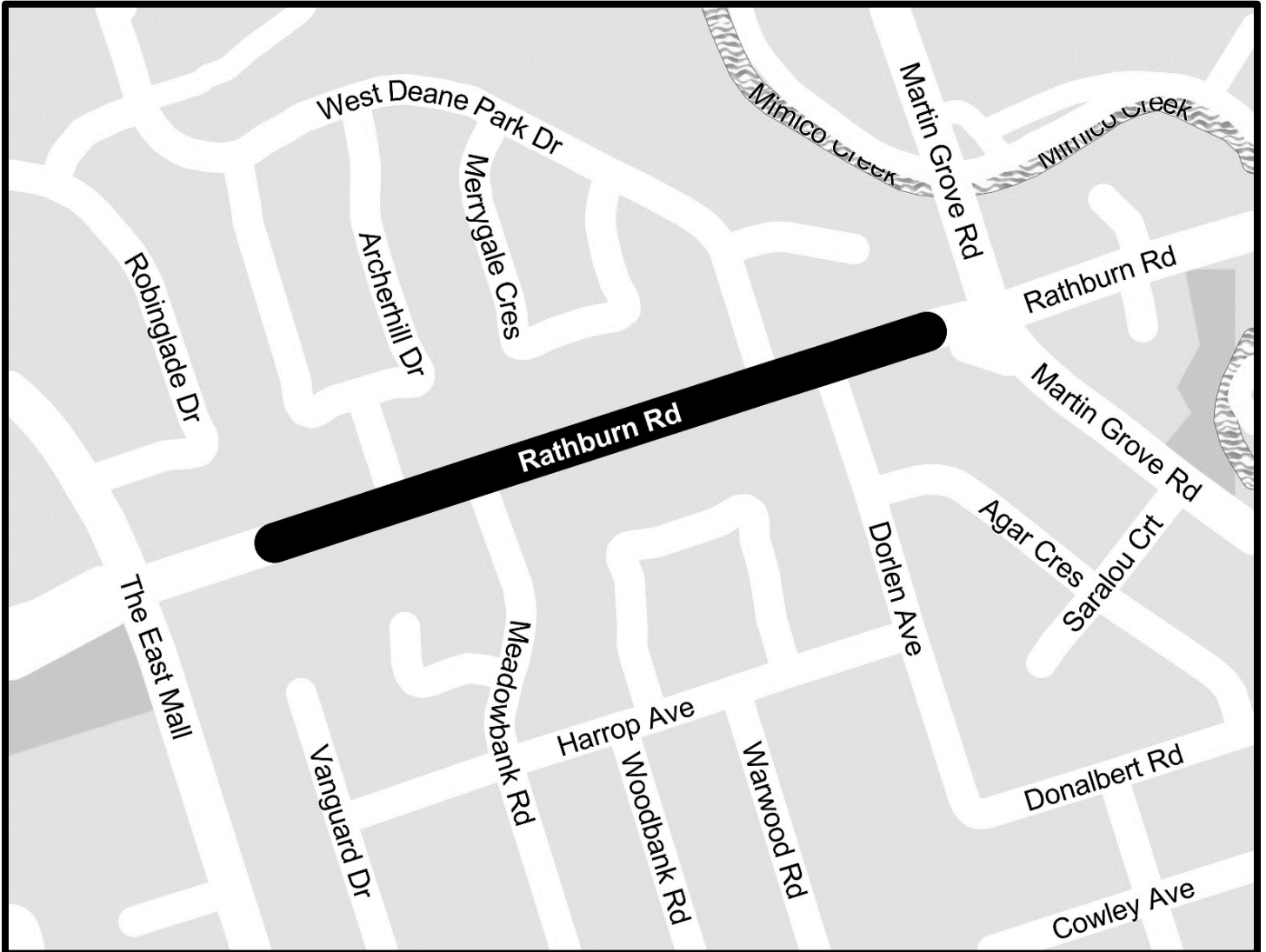
WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Saturday.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Manager.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>Traffic on Rathburn Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction to be shared by cyclists and motorists in the vicinity of the work.</p>
	<p>TTC Service: This project may affect travel times on the 48 Rathburn Road bus. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing</p> <p>There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>City Owned Trees: due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove 1 street tree from the City's boulevard on Rathburn Road, to facilitate upgrades to a TTC bus landing platform. If this tree is near your property, you will receive a separate notice. For every street tree removed due to this work, the City will plant a replacement tree of at least 60mm in diameter.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
