Rosehill Pumping Station: Standby Power Generators Testing and Commissioning

Contract: 17ECS-MI-02WA Start Date: October 2017 End Date: September 30, 2020* *Timeline is subject to change.


The City of Toronto is nearing completion of the building envelope rehabilitation and related addition of a standby power generation facility at the Rosehill Pumping Station located at 240 Mount Pleasant Road. This rehabilitation work began October 2017. Remaining work activities include equipment testing and commissioning and site restoration.

This work will help to ensure resilience and long term sustainability of the pumping station by the addition of a standby power facility and bringing its structural condition to a state of good repair. This is essential to guarantee safe, reliable and secure drinking water supply. This project is part of the 2017 Council-approved capital budget and 2017-2026 Approved Capital Plan for Toronto Water.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

The Province of Ontario has enacted a declaration of emergency to help contain the spread of COVID-19 and protect the public. A list of essential workplaces in Ontario was announced on March 23. As indicated on the list, City-led infrastructure construction has been deemed essential and this project will proceed. This construction is essential to ensure the City's infrastructure remain safe, in a state of good repair and able to meet Toronto's needs. - Equipment testing and commissioning of standby power generators
- Finishing work, removal of site trailers and site restoration

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING REMAINING CONSTRUCTION PHASES

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences during the commissioning and site restoration/landscaping phases. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- A significant cause of noise will be the testing of the Standby Power Generators during the
 equipment commissioning phase which is scheduled to occur in May and June of 2020. The noise
 will be the sound of engines running and will be within City Bylaw and regulatory limits but will be
 detectable off-site.
- The standby power generator facility uses diesel generators which typically operate for brief
 periods during utility power outages. It is also typical for the generators to run during periods of
 peak electricity demand (i.e. power "brown outs" during summer heat waves) and for monthly
 operational tests required by the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP).
- However, during the testing and commissioning phase, the generators will need to operate on a
 daily basis for equipment testing and MECP air emission approvals purposes. This daily generator
 testing work is planned to occur during June and July of 2020 with occasional short-term pretesting also occurring in May of 2020.
- To limit community disturbance, all work related to generator operation and testing during commissioning will take place between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.



Work Hours: Work unrelated to generator testing will take place from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM, Monday to Friday.



Site Access: Contractor vehicles will enter and exit through the pumping station entrance off Mount Pleasant Road.



Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required.
