Bridge Rehabilitations on Berry Creek Drive and Drumheller Road over Berry Creek

Expected Start Date: June 15, 2020 Expected End Date: March 31, 2021*

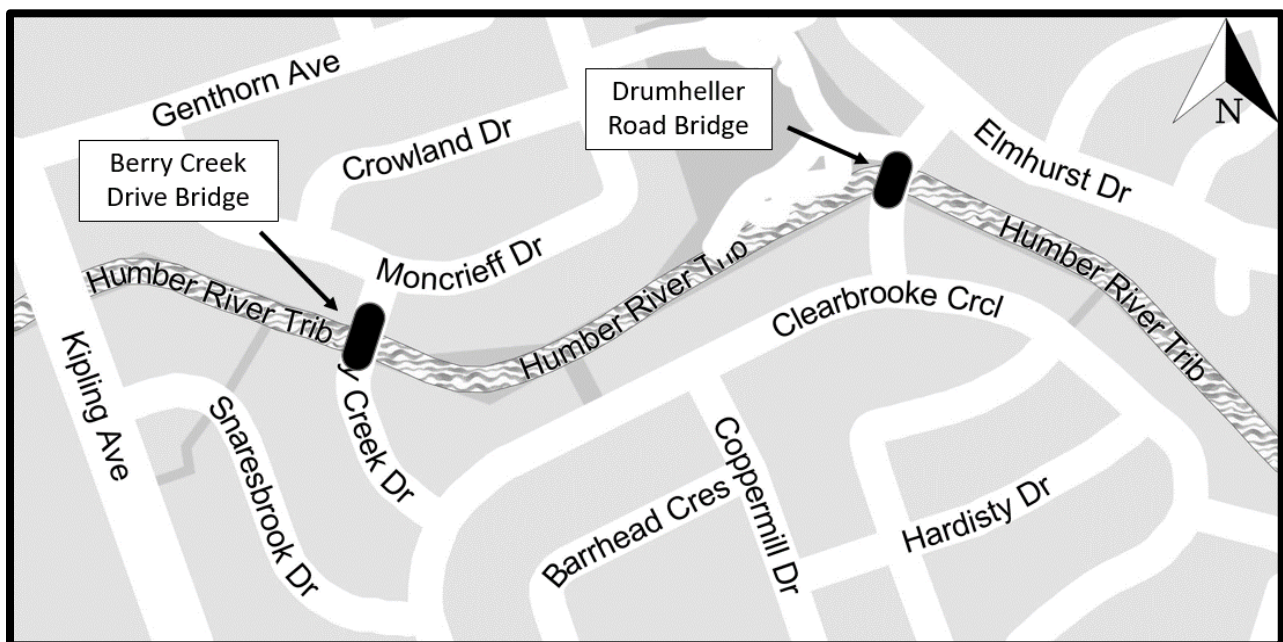

The City of Toronto will rehabilitate two bridges over Berry Creek, the Berry Creek Drive Bridge and Drumheller Road Bridge. This work will ensure that the bridges meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. This project is part of the 2020 Council-approved Capital Works Program.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. The City's contractor will:

- Construct new parapet wall and new handrails
- Replace the concrete deck and sidewalks
- Replace asphalt surface and waterproofing
- Replace retaining walls and naturalize creek bed

Stage / Location	Dates	Traffic Management
Stage 1 Drumheller Road Bridge Superstructure	June 2020 to August 2020	Drumheller Road Bridge will be closed to vehicular through traffic, and will reopen to traffic before the Berry Creek Drive Bridge closes.
Stage 2 – Berry Creek Drive Bridge Superstructure	August 2020 to October 2020	Berry Creek Drive Bridge will be closed to vehicular through traffic when the Drumheller Road Bridge opens to traffic.
Stage 3 – In-Water Work under the bridges	October 2020 to March 2021	Vehicular traffic will be maintained when the contractor is working in-water under both the Drumheller Road Bridge and Berry Creek Drive Bridge.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours: Work will take place 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays.
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work area.</p> <p>At least one sidewalk will remain open at all times on both Drumheller Road and Berry Creek Drive. Temporary signage will direct pedestrians to safely cross the bridge.</p>
	Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays due to detouring the closed bridge sites.
	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect the availability of on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed during construction will be replaced.
