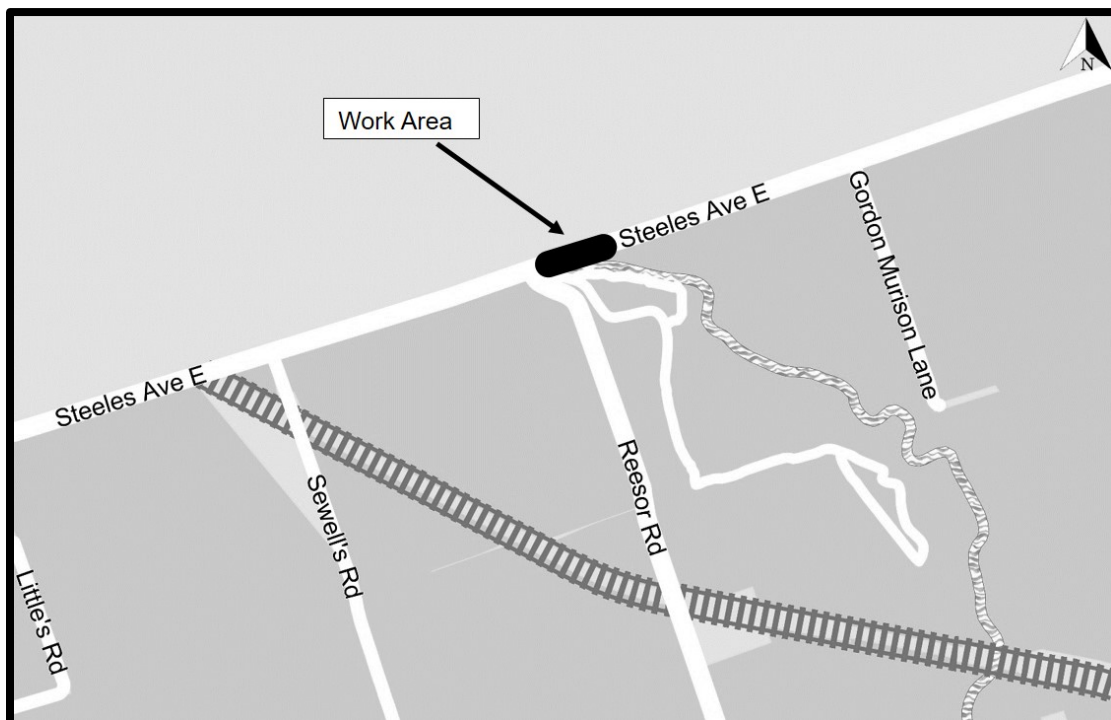

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Steeles Avenue East Bridge over Little Rouge Creek near Reesor Road. The inspection of the bridge shows that there is a need to repair a sinkhole at the bridge. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO


The Province of Ontario has enacted a declaration of emergency to help contain the spread of COVID-19 and protect the public. WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and the road with the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
