Storm Sewer and Outfall Replacement on Toryork Drive

Expected Start Date: Spring 2020 Expected End Date: Summer 2020

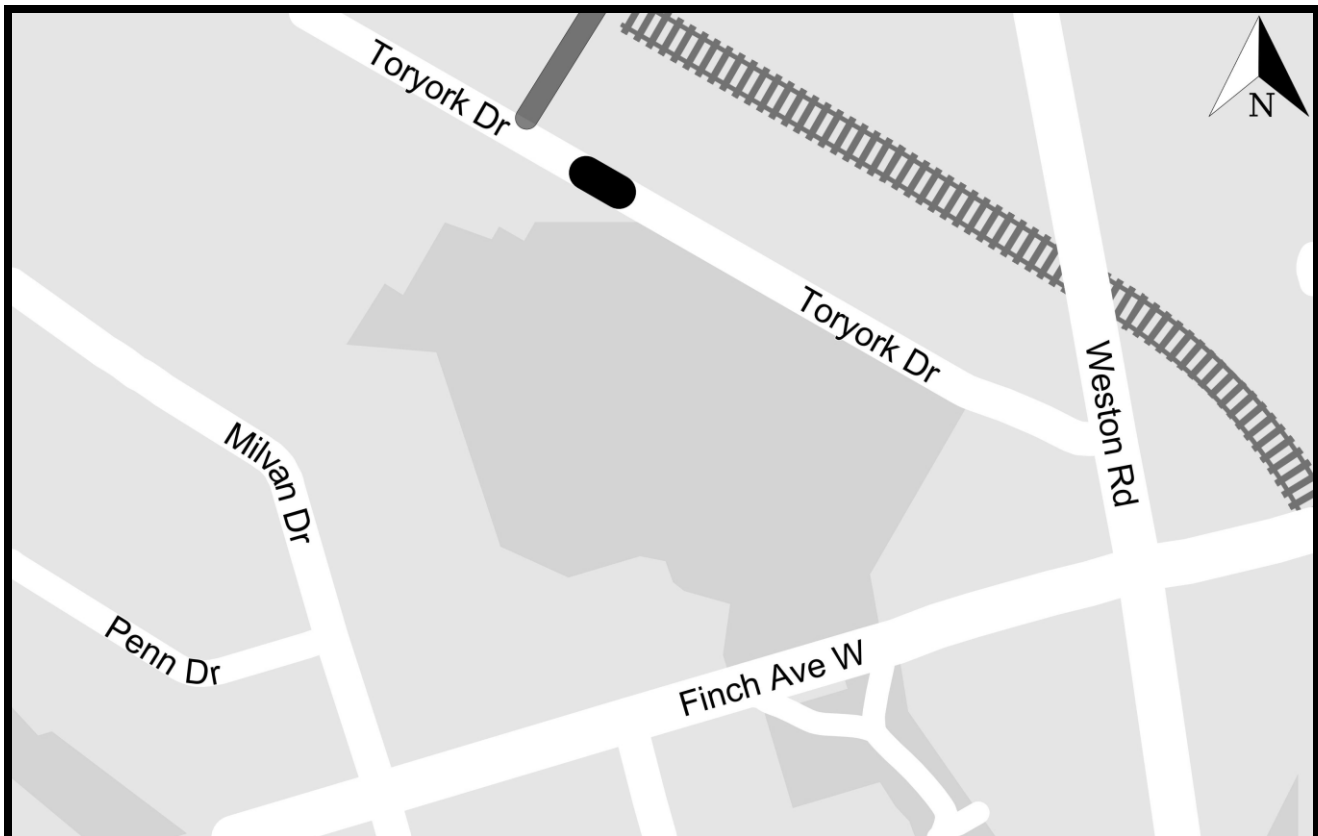

The City of Toronto is planning to replace the existing storm sewer and outfall located on Toryork Drive next to the Toronto Fire Station 411 at 75 Toryork Drive.

The storm sewer is a large underground pipe designed to collect stormwater and melting snow and release it into a nearby creek or river. The outfall is located at the end of the storm sewer where the pipe releases the collected water into the nearby creek or river.



This project is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program and the City's stormwater infrastructure improvement program that will improve the City's aging infrastructure to bring them to a good state of repair.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable to ensure they are not affected by the work.
- Before construction begins, a construction notice will be provided to area residents providing more precise information regarding the construction duration and specific closures.
- Majority of this work will occur within Toronto Region and Conservation Authority (TRCA) lands.
- There will also be construction activity in the Toronto Fire Station 411 parking lot for a few months. Construction fence will be installed to separate the construction work from public activities.

	<p>Tree Removal: Due to the nature of this project, the City will need to remove approximately 30 trees within the outfall corridor. Tree removal permits have been obtained in coordination with the City’s Urban Forestry Division as well as the Toronto Regional Conservation Authority (TRCA). Trees removed for the project will be replaced using a replacement ratio of three trees planted for every one tree removed.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
