## Long Branch Sanitary Trunk Sewer Rehabilitation

Contract: 18ECS-LU-01TT

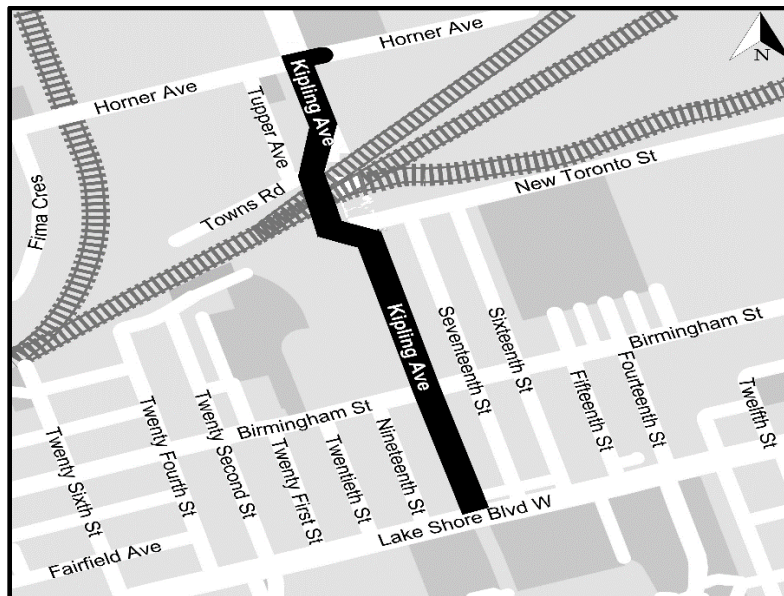
Start Date: July 20, 2020 End Date: June 01, 2021

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating a section of the Long Branch Sanitary Trunk Sewer (STS) under Kipling Avenue from Lake Shore Boulevard West to Horner Avenue. The majority of the work will take place on Kipling Avenue, with some work on Horner Avenue and Towns Road.

The sanitary trunk sewer is an underground pipe that collects wastewater from sewers and delivers it to wastewater facilities for treatment. This project is part of the Council-approved 2019 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of these trunk sewer sections by approximately 50 years.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

The Province of Ontario has enacted a declaration of emergency to help contain the spread of COVID-19 and protect the public. A list of essential workplaces in Ontario was announced on March 23 and revised on April 3. As indicated on the list, City-led infrastructure construction has been deemed essential and this project will proceed. This construction is essential to ensure the City's infrastructure remain safe, in a state of good repair and able to meet Toronto's needs. ## WORK DETAILS





The City's contractor will:





- Install temporary pumps and pipes to divert flow from the sewer so that it can be repaired from inside. The temporary pipes will be placed along Kipling Avenue and Horner Avenue;
- Re-line the existing pipes using a trenchless method to fix the pipe by inserting a resin-filled sock into the pipe through maintenance holes and curing in place with steam. When cured, a new pipe is formed within the existing pipe;
- Rehabilitate existing maintenance holes and install a new maintenance hole

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, lane closures, transit disruptions, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required. When the sock liner is curing, it takes 8-10 hours once initiated. There may be temporary sewer bypass operations and construction activity may be extended.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation (level access to driveway, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p><b>Pre-Construction Inspection:</b> Capital Sewer Works, under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if any damage to your property was caused by the City's construction. The inspection will look at the exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p><b>Sewer Service Disruptions:</b> If the sanitary sewer service from your property requires a disruption to complete repairs, the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice with more specific information advising you to limit your water use.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>There will be sidewalk closure on Kipling Avenue on the east side of the street between New Toronto Street to Horner Avenue. Property access will be maintained.</b></p>

	<p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Physical Distancing</b>          There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p><b>City Owned Trees:</b> Due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove 3 street trees from the City's boulevard. If this affects a tree near your property, you will receive a separate notice. For each street tree removed, associated with the work, the City will plant one replacement tree of at least 50mm in diameter. This work will be overseen by the City's Parks, Forestry &amp; Recreation Division.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b><i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></b></p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Kipling Avenue (northbound), from Lake Shore Boulevard West to Horner Avenue, will be reduced to one lane of traffic.</li> <li>• Traffic through the Kipling Avenue and Lake Shore Boulevard West intersection and on Colonel Samuel Smith Park Drive will be reduced to one lane.</li> <li>• Please consider alternate routes on Nineteenth Street, Birmingham Street and Seventeenth Street.</li> <li>• A short section of Towns Road between Kipling Avenue to Tupper Avenue, will be reduced to one lane of traffic with flagged two-way access.</li> <li>• Horner Avenue (eastbound), from Tupper Avenue past the Kipling Avenue intersection, will be to one lane of traffic. Driveways will be accessible.</li> </ul>

	<p><b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call <b>416-808-2222</b> for its location.</p>
	<p><b>Parking Violation Notice:</b> In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, the City encourages communities with construction to be patient as neighbours may need to temporarily relocate vehicles. If enforcement is called, enforcement must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket). If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on the Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number.</li> <li>2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking violation notice.</li> </ol> <p><b>You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Please note:</b> violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
	<p><b>TTC Service:</b> The 501 Queen and 508 Lake Shore Streetcar, along with the 44, 944, and 110AB Kipling buses may be affected by this construction <b>Visit: <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for accurate route information.</b></p>
