## TTC Track Replacement, Road Resurfacing, and Intersection Improvements on Howard Park from the High Park Loop to Dundas Street West

The City and TTC work on Howard Park continues. Important parking and traffic management information is provided below.

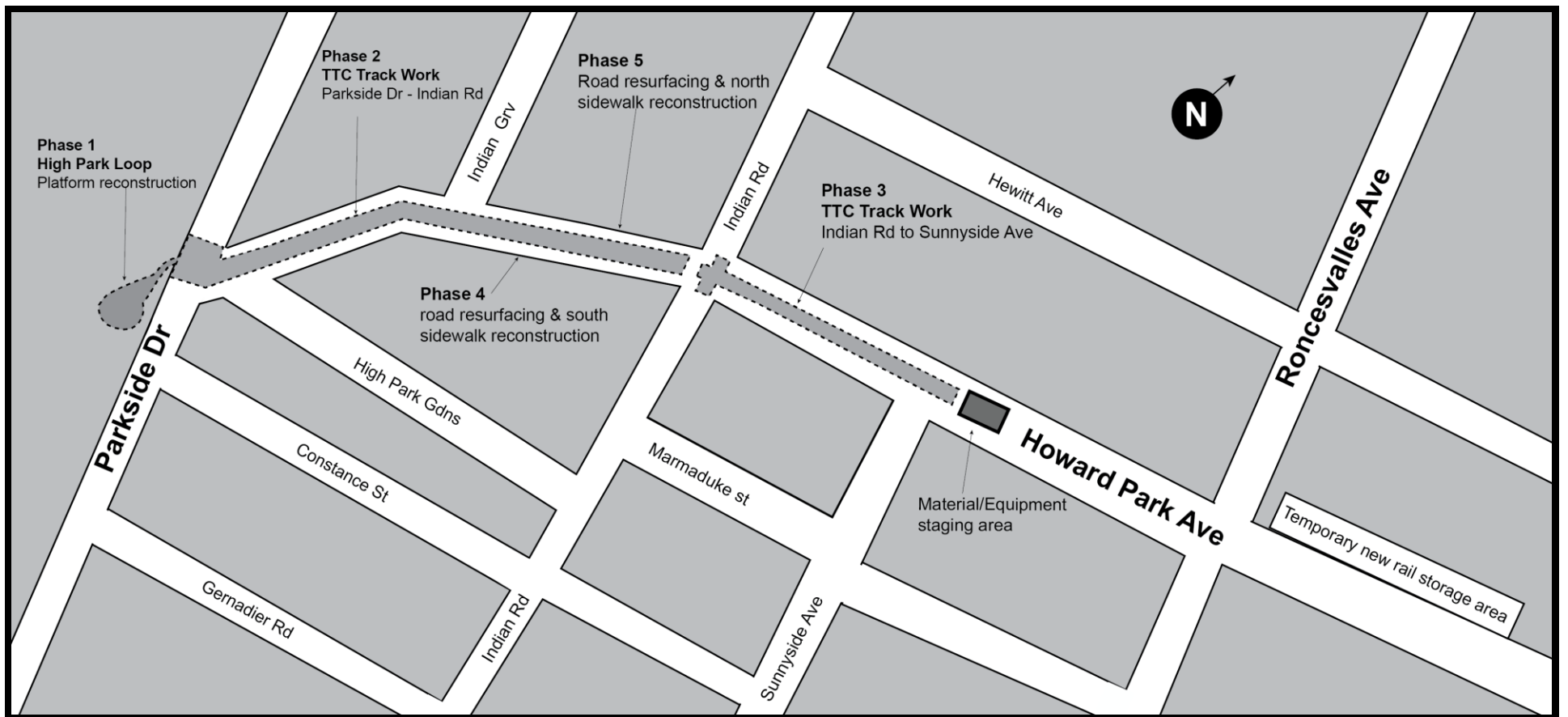

<b>Phase 1:</b> High Park Loop – <b>July 6 to mid-September</b>	TTC track crews are currently installing new rail inside the loop on a 24-hour schedule.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>One way in each direction on Parkside Drive</li> </ul>	
<b>Phase 2:</b> Howard Park from Parkside Drive to Indian Road <b>July 20 to Late August</b>	Crews will remove and replace track from the Parkside Drive to the west side of Indian Road.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Howard Park Avenue will be fully closed between Parkside Drive and the west side of Indian Road</li> <li>there will be no access to driveways</li> <li>Indian Grove or High Park Gardens will not have access to Howard Park</li> </ul>	  <b>On Howard Park after 6:30 a.m. July 20, 2020 for Phase 2.</b>
Howard Park and Parkside Drive Intersection  <b>Monday July 20 to Friday July 25</b>	Crews will improve the Parkside/Howard Park intersection by: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>removing the right-turn channel, traffic signal infrastructure, some pole, sidewalk and roadway replacement</li> </ul> Breaking and excavation for track replacement to the east half of the intersection will start at <b>7 a.m. on Monday, July 20.</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Northbound and southbound traffic on Parkside Drive will be maintained using one shared lane. Toronto Police will be onsite to manage traffic movement.</li> <li>On Saturday, July 25 after track replacement is completed, a lane in each direction will be provided to maintain traffic while other civil work continues at the intersection.</li> <li>High Park Gardens will be temporarily converted to allow two-way operation for approximately a 5-day period. On-street parking will remain on High Park Gardens during this time.</li> </ul>	
<b>TTC Material Storage</b>		<b>Parking</b>	
TTC track materials and work equipment will be parked on the streetcar track lanes on Howard Park Avenue east of Sunnyside Avenue. The contractor will utilize storage space east of Indian Road.		There is no parking in the material storage area and to allow for local traffic between Indian Road and Roncesvalles Avenue

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p><b>Work Hours: Work on this project will take place 24 hours 7 days a week. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will be carried out at various times throughout the day. All concrete breaking activities will occur between 7am and 11 p.m.</b> Around-the-clock work during rail installation by TTC is required to preserve the integrity and quality of new rail and concrete. Overnight rail work by TTC may consist of moving/pulling the new rail strings along Howard Park Avenue through the Parkside Drive intersection and into position, rail installation and rail welding / grinding.</p>

	<p><b>Noise:</b> Various construction activities will generate unavoidable noise during periods of the project within the entire work zone, machinery and materials moving, workers communicating etc. <b>We thank you for your patience during construction.</b></p>
	<p><b>Physical Distancing</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing. Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage and Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</b></p>
