Culvert Replacement on The Westway over Humber Creek


Contract: 20ECS-TI-05BE Start Date: July 20, 2020 End Date: March 31, 2021 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will replace the culvert on The Westway over Humber Creek. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. This work is in addition to the recently completed road resurfacing projects on Royal York Road and The Westway. The project is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. The City's contractor will:

- Replace the The Westway culvert over Humber Creek
- Reconstruct the concrete retaining walls, concrete parapet walls, steel beam guide rails, curbs, sidewalks, and asphalt

Phase 2 South half of culvert North sidewalk open	December 2020 to March 2021

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Construction Notice

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 11 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.		
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.		
	One sidewalk along The Westway will be maintained at all times.		
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.		
	The traffic management plan is shown in a table on page one of this Construction Notice.		
	Due to location of traffic restrictions on The Westway, it may be difficult to access Saskatoon Drive. Motorists are encouraged to follow suggested route alternates on page one.		
\rightarrow	Physical Distancing		
	There are times when contractors need to communicate with property owners about the work happening nearby. This could be about driveway or sidewalk access, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.		
	Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.		
Ė	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.		
	TTC Impacts: TTC stops along The Westway may be impacted during the work. Signage will direct bus users to temporary bus stop locations. Visit ttc.ca for accurate schedule information.		
	Restoration: Area affected by construction will be restored.
