Storm Sewer Rehabilitation on Sunrise Avenue

Contract: 18ECS-LU-02TT

Expected Start Date: September 2020 Expected End Date: December 2021

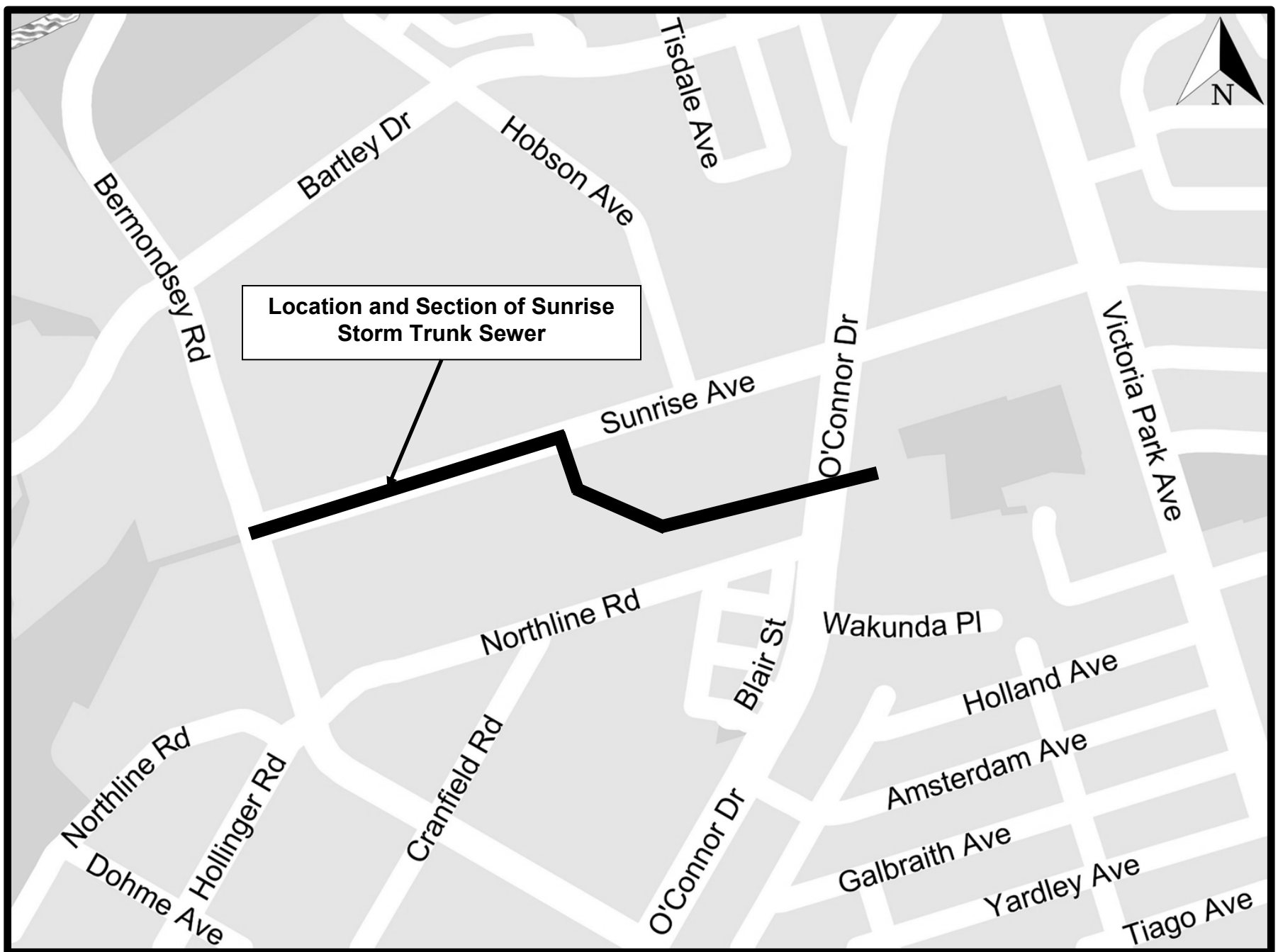

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the Sunrise Storm Sewer (STM). The Sunrise STM is located on Sunrise Avenue, east from Bermondsey Road for 320 m within the City's Right of Way, then proceeds along the City's Permanent Easement between Sunrise Avenue and Northline Road to O'Connor Drive. The Sunrise STM continues and crosses O'Connor Drive to Parma Park.

The Sunrise STM is an underground pipe that collects stormwater and melting snow from various streets and discharges it to a nearby creek or river.

This project is part of the Council-Approved 2020 Capital Works Program to renew the City's aging sewer infrastructure and will extend the service life of this storm sewer section by approximately 50 years.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the Contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. WORK DETAILS

The project site is located within the City's Right of Way and Temporary and Permanent Easements. The contractor will move equipment on-site and prepare the work area before construction begins. Work will take place on Sunrise Avenue from Bermondsey Road to O'Connor Drive, and between Sunrise Avenue and Northline Road.









The contractor will:

- Install temporary bypass pumps and pipes to maintain sewer service during sewer lining;

- Rehabilitate the mainline sewer pipe. The sewer will be lined using a trenchless relining method. In relining, a sock filled with resin is inserted into the sewer pipe through an existing maintenance hole, and the sock is then cured with steam. Once cured, a new pipe is formed inside the existing pipe;
- Rehabilitate maintenance holes;
- Remove temporary access areas and construction vehicles and equipment from the site; and
- Restore areas affected by construction.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise, trail closures, and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately-owned items on City property, within the right-of-way or easement areas.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday. However, the curing of the sock liner takes 8 to 10 hours once initiated. As such, the temporary sewer bypass and construction activity may continue outside regular working hours.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing:</p> <p>There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the Contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: There will be no impact to driveways. Residents who require accommodation (level access to driveway, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Project Manager to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: The Contractor will survey and photograph all private properties and business-owned facilities within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if damage was caused during construction. The survey will include an inspection of the exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Refer to Condition Survey/Inspection notice for more details. The Contractor will deliver a separate notice requesting a time to set up survey appointments. Inspection staff will wear photo identification and carry photographic equipment during the survey.</p>
	<p>Tree Removals: Due to the nature of this project, the contractor will have to remove 17 trees along the City's permanent easement of the sewer to facilitate construction work and to create the needed access to the sewer maintenance holes. 17 trees will be replaced.</p> <p>A restoration plan approved by the City's Parks Forestry & Recreation Services and the Toronto and Region Conservation Authority will be implemented, which includes planting up to 46 trees, 80 shrubs and seeding to naturalize the area when construction is complete.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: There will be some local road closures/impacts:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Traffic management on Northbound and Southbound lanes of Bermondsey Road will be reduced to one lane in each direction temporarily between Northline Road to Bartley Drive Road with no interruptions to property access. • The sidewalks on Bermondsey Road will remain open at all times. • The TTC bus stop at the north-west corner of Bermondsey Road and Sunrise Avenue will be temporarily relocated during the traffic management. • Traffic management for short term closures on Sunrise Avenue in the work area will be required. Local traffic will be maintained.
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</p>
	<p>Restoration: Areas affected by construction will be restored when construction is complete.</p>
