In response to COVID-19, The City of Toronto Film, Television and Digital Media Office has revised the filming approval/objection solicitation process to limit the physical interactions between film crews and residents. If the majority of residents do not object to the requested exemption(s), the film permit will be issued. If you choose to object to the requested film guideline exemptions below, your objection must be registered by **(date to be stated by production/24 hours prior)**.

We will be filming EXTERIOR LATE NIGHT scenes at
215 King St W, David Pecaut Square
August 5th, 2017 between the hours of 1PM – 3AM

Our production vehicles and various pieces of film equipment will be located on:

- North side Wellington St W between John St and Simcoe St
- North side Clarence Square between Spadina Ave and Wellington St W
- South side Front St between Portland St and Spadina Ave

We will begin reserving the above areas with cones on August 4th at 7 am, with vehicles arriving August 5th at 7am, and departing August 6th by 12 pm.

Pursuant to the City of Toronto's Filming Guidelines, we are requesting your approval on the exemption of by-law:

#5. Restrictions & Limitations: Filming between 11PM-7AM.

#6. Limitations: Filming in a residential area more than twice in a calendar year

#7.1. Lighting: Lighting between 11PM – 7AM.
