This notice provides an update on a number of construction projects on Bathurst Street, between Fort York Boulevard and Dundas Street West.

Project	Description	
TTC track replacement	Work will begin on <u>September 21</u> , south of Dundas Street West. This work will substantially impact traffic and parking on Bathurst Street from Wolseley Street to Dundas Street West.	
Watermain replacement	Completion of this work is ahead of schedule and expected to be completed in October 2020. Once work is completed, all travel lanes on Bathurst Street from Front Street West to Queen Street West will be restored.	
Bridge rehabilitation	Originally expected to be completed in December 2020, the City's contractor has been slightly delayed and expects to finish work in January 2021.	

Bathurst Street from Front Street West and Fort York Boulevard will continue to be CLOSED to ALL vehicles until January 2021.

We know this project has had an impact on businesses and residents along Bathurst Street, especially due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We sympathize and appreciate your patience with the dust, noise, fencing and other inconveniences of this infrastructure construction.

<u>E</u>	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Public Consultation Unit listed on Page 4 to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Pre-Construction Inspection: A third party contractor will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts (Dundas Street, from Wolseley Avenue to Dundas Street ONLY). Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting a time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.
	Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.
	Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	During the TTC track replacement work, there will be no access to driveways or roadways on the east side of Bathurst Street from north of Wolseley Street to south of Dundas Street West.
	Garbage & Recycling : Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	TTC Route Information: 511/307 Bathurst buses are currently diverting around the Bathurst Bridge closure both ways via: Front Street, Spadina Avenue and Fort York Boulevard.
	Starting September 21 and continuing for the duration of the track work between Dundas Street and Queen Street, <i>southbound</i> 511/307 Bathurst buses will also divert via: Dundas Street, Spadina Avenue, and Queen Street. <i>Northbound</i> Bathurst buses will be maintained north of Queen Street, transitioning into the southbound curb lane. Buses will not serve transit stops between Queen Street and Dundas Street.
	 For more service information, visit TTC.ca Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
