

# Basement Flooding Remediation & Water Quality Study

## Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Master Plan Area 43 (York Mills area)

### Notice of File Availability

In 2017, the City of Toronto initiated a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study to determine contributing factors for surface and basement flooding. The objective of the study is to provide recommendations for City infrastructure improvements to reduce the risk of future flooding.

Study Area 43, located in the Yorks Mills and Don Mills Road area, has experienced basement and surface flooding during severe rainstorms in the past.

Following consultation with agencies, City Divisions and the public, the City accepted the consultant's recommendation to upsize and install new storm and sanitary sewers, and modify the catchbasin capacity by installing inlet control devices and high capacity inlets. These projects fall under Schedule A and A+ of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment document. Schedule A and A+ projects are pre-approved, many may proceed to implementation.

A project file has been completed and describes the public and review agency consultation, the identification of alternative solutions, selection of the preferred alternative, and evaluation of the impacts of the recommended infrastructure upgrades. The City intends to proceed with the design and construction of high-priority projects in the coming years.
