Phase 2: Basement Flooding Protection Program on Glenwood Crescent

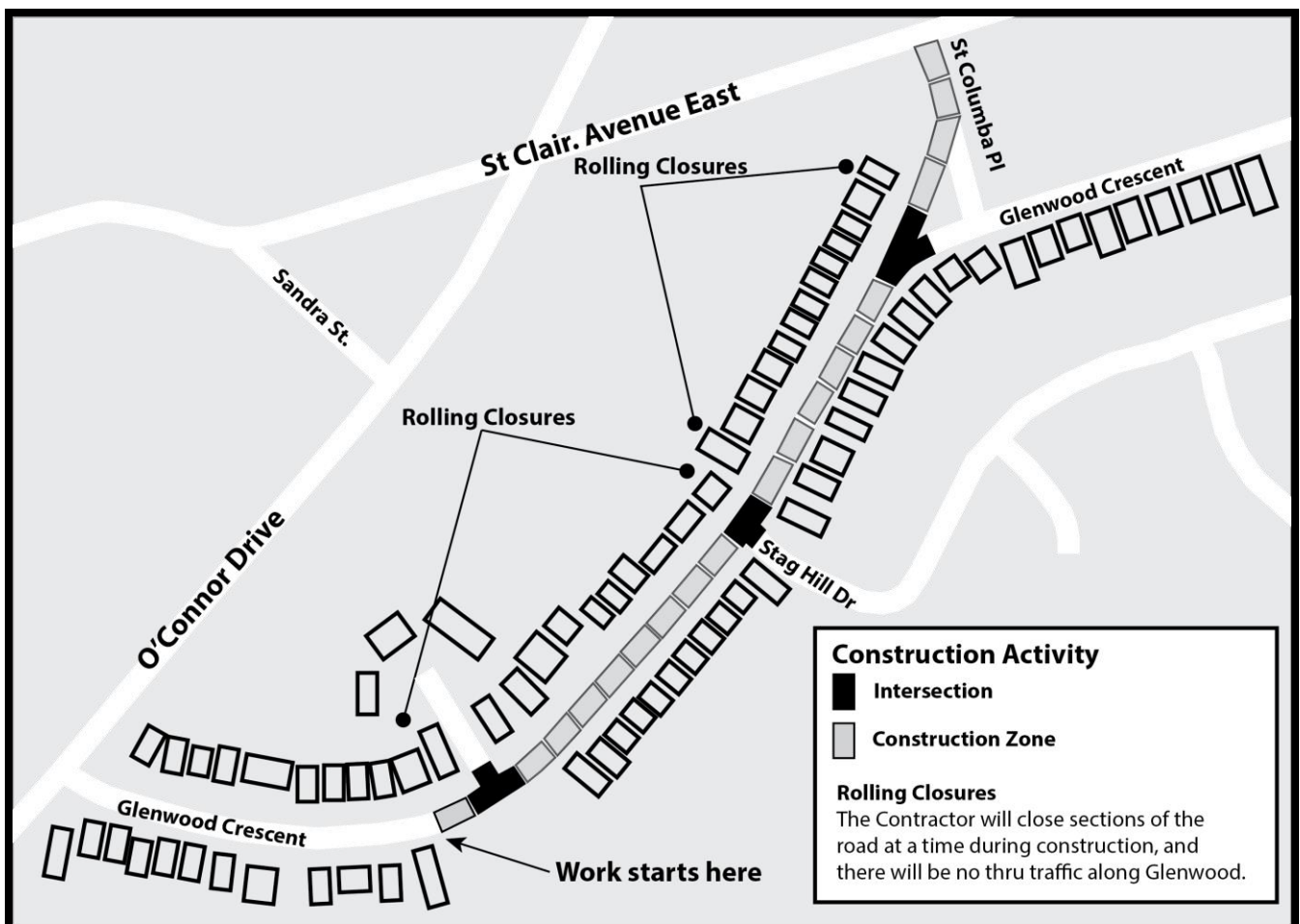
The City of Toronto will upgrade the sanitary and storm sewers, and replace the watermain on Glenwood Crescent from Glenwood Terrace to St. Columba Place.

As part of the construction, the Contractor will install storm sewer box culverts, curb to curb, on Glenwood Crescent. The project will require rolling closures which means that the Contractor will close sections of the road at a time during construction, and there will be no thru traffic along Glenwood. Residents will be notified in advance of closures of front of their homes.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT LEAD WATER SERVICES

If you live on any of the streets and areas shown in the maps in a house that was built before the mid-1950s, your water service may be made of lead. Please read the attached fact sheet with important information about the risks of lead water services, especially if someone in your house is pregnant, there are children under six years old, or there is an infant drinking formula made using tap water.

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE





The Contractor will:

Install the box culvert storm sewer, sanitary sewer, watermain and all substandard water services. Permanently restore the trench area in the roadway and areas affected by construction. Work will begin in the south end of Glenwood Crescent, from Glenwood Terrace and move up towards St. Columba Place.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You may continue to experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekend as required.</p>
	<p>Pre-Construction Inspection: WHS (Wristen's Home Specialties Inc.) under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. Participation in the survey is voluntary; however, participating is important in determining if the construction caused damage. The inspection will look at both the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. The company will deliver a separate notice requesting time to set up appointments. All inspection staff will be wearing photo identification and carrying photographic equipment during their work.</p>
	<p>Water Service Disruptions: From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the Contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. Throughout the work, it is recommended that you temporarily disconnect any water treatment systems (i.e. softeners or filters), water-cooled air conditioners or similar plumbing fixtures. Automatic lawn sprinkler systems may also be affected, therefore, you may need to water manually. In the event you did not receive advanced notice, an emergency water shut off could have been necessary.</p>
	<p>Substandard Water Service Replacement: Please take the time to read the attached fact sheet carefully as it contains important information on lead in drinking water and how to prepare for replacement. 	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: During the installation of the storm sewer box culverts, there will be an extended period of time when you will not have access to your driveway. The Contractor will notify you of restrictions to your driveway and alternative parking arrangements will be made.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> Due to the area required for construction, there will be rolling road closures on Glenwood Crescent of approximately 100 m at a time. <input type="checkbox"/> The Contractor will work with residents to ensure minimal disruption.

	<p>Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects the construction work, it will be re-located with no charge to the owner. If your vehicle is moved, please contact parking control for its location at 416-808-2222.</p> <p>The upcoming work on Glenwood Crescent will create parking and driveway restrictions within the active stages of construction. The City will work with residents to make arrangements for alternate parking. City staff will record your address and licence plate number to ensure parking access in alternate areas. If you have not already done so, please contact the Field Ambassador listed below with your address and license plate number to receive a parking pass.</p> <p>In the event you receive a traffic ticket for on-street parking during this period of construction, you may choose to dispute your ticket following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking infraction notice.</p> <p><i>You may use this notice as part of your defense for parking consideration during construction; however, the Field Ambassador does not have the authority to cancel any parking tickets.</i></p>
	<p>Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact City staff at 416-392-6681 or bfppinquiries@toronto.ca.</p>
	<p>Garbage & Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the Contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them.</p> <p><i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i></p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
