## Basement Flooding Protection Program on Glenwood Crescent


**Contract: 18ECS-LU-04FP**  
**Spring Start Date: June 15, 2020**  
**End Date: Spring, 2021**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City plans to resume construction on Glenwood Crescent in mid-June. The project team has worked with the contractor to develop the construction schedule to ensure as much construction work as possible is completed in 2020. There may be some restoration work in 2021 but that won't be determined or finalized until later this year.

The City recognizes that residents along Glenwood Crescent have been greatly impacted by this construction and have experienced several service disruptions during the first phase of this project in 2019. In response to resident concerns, Councillor Brad Bradford (Ward 19) is hosting an online public meeting to discuss the restart of construction on Glenwood Crescent and what residents can expect during construction in 2020. City staff will be available at this meeting to answer resident questions and address construction related issues. Details are listed below.

**IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO**

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. **Construction Schedule**

The City has prepared a bi-weekly construction schedule breakdown so the community knows what to expect between June and November 2020. *This has been emailed separately.*  
 A short summary is provided below:

**From mid-June to early-July, crews will:**

- Install the temporary watermain, water services, and sanitary sewer bypass
- The bypass systems must be installed and commissioned before excavation for the box culvert can begin.

**\*From July to October over 17 Weeks, crews will:**

- Install the sewers and watermain on Glenwood Crescent, St. Columba Place and St. Clair Avenue East

## Restoration Work

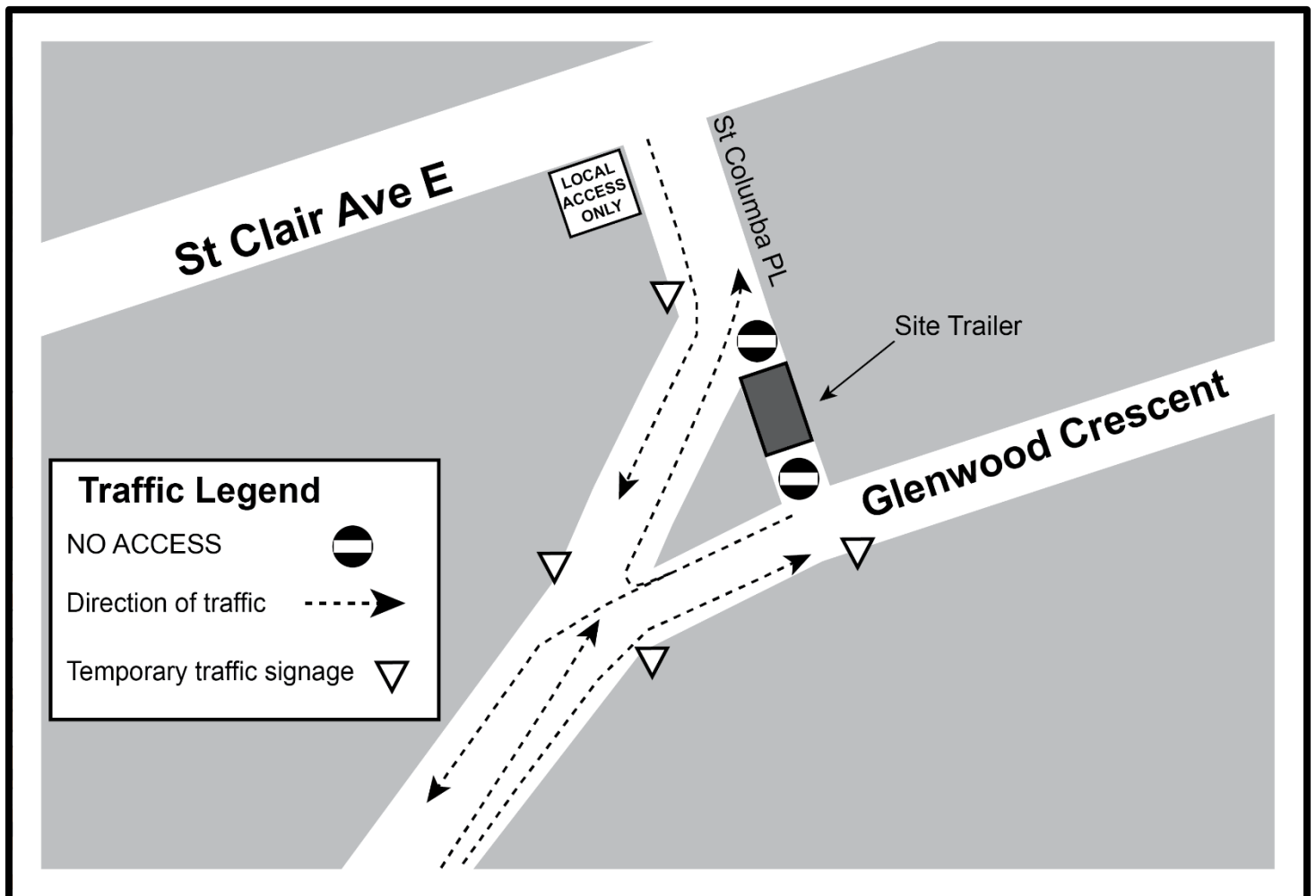
The permanent restoration of asphalt, curbs, sidewalks, and landscaping will be completed in phases. We are currently working with the contractor to determine the best sequence for the restoration works, which will be determined to minimize impacts on residents and local traffic.

**Please note:** restoration depends on more favourable weather, the City is committed to completing all permanent restoration in 2020 if possible.

## **TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT DURING CONSTRUCTION**

### Intersection of St. Columba and Glenwood Crescent








There will be modifications to the local access between Glenwood Crescent and St. Clair Avenue East on St. Columba Place in order to allow safe storage of construction equipment and materials. Drivers entering St. Columba from St. Clair are advised to observe all temporary traffic signage, as the west side of the traffic island will be converted to two-way operation. Please see map below:



### Additional Traffic Management Information

- There will be a full road closure on St. Columba when the box culvert, sanitary sewer, and watermain are replaced at that location (September to October 2020).
- Some lanes of St. Clair Avenue East will be closed for sewer, maintenance hole, and watermain installation (October 2020).
- There will be rolling road closures on Glenwood as the storm sewer box culvert, sanitary sewer and watermain work progresses from Stag Hill to St. Columba (June 29 to September 4 2020).
- Temporary (one working day), partial or full road closures will also take place during paving activities.

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from <b>7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., Monday to Friday</b>, with some work on weekends as approved by the City.</p>
	<p><b>Vibration Monitoring:</b> When work resumes, the contractor will re-implement full time remote vibration monitoring with real-time alerts to site staff when construction vibration levels approach the cautionary limit.</p>
	<p><b>Driveway Access During Paving:</b> Residents on the sections of Glenwood Crescent between Glenwood Terrace and Stag Hill, and between Glen Gannon Drive and Rexleigh Drive, may not have access to their driveways during paving and will be asked to park their vehicles outside of the work area. Residents are directed to contact the Field Ambassador to receive a parking pass during the time when driveway access is restricted</p>
	<p><b>Materials/Equipment:</b> Due to the limited space on the site, some materials and equipment will be stored on the roadway, as safely as possible. This will be closely monitored by inspection staff. Sidewalks will be kept clear of debris, when possible, or closed off.</p>
	<p><b>Housekeeping:</b> To ensure the site is kept clean and safe, the contractor will apply best practices to manage the dust on site, and stockpiles will be kept off sidewalks. There will be no night sweeping. Additionally, there will be increased monitoring on site to ensure that sidewalks and roads are as safe as possible.</p>
	<p><b>Sidewalks:</b> Within the immediate sewer construction area will be closed for safety reasons.</p>
	<p><b>Physical Distancing</b></p> <p>There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>

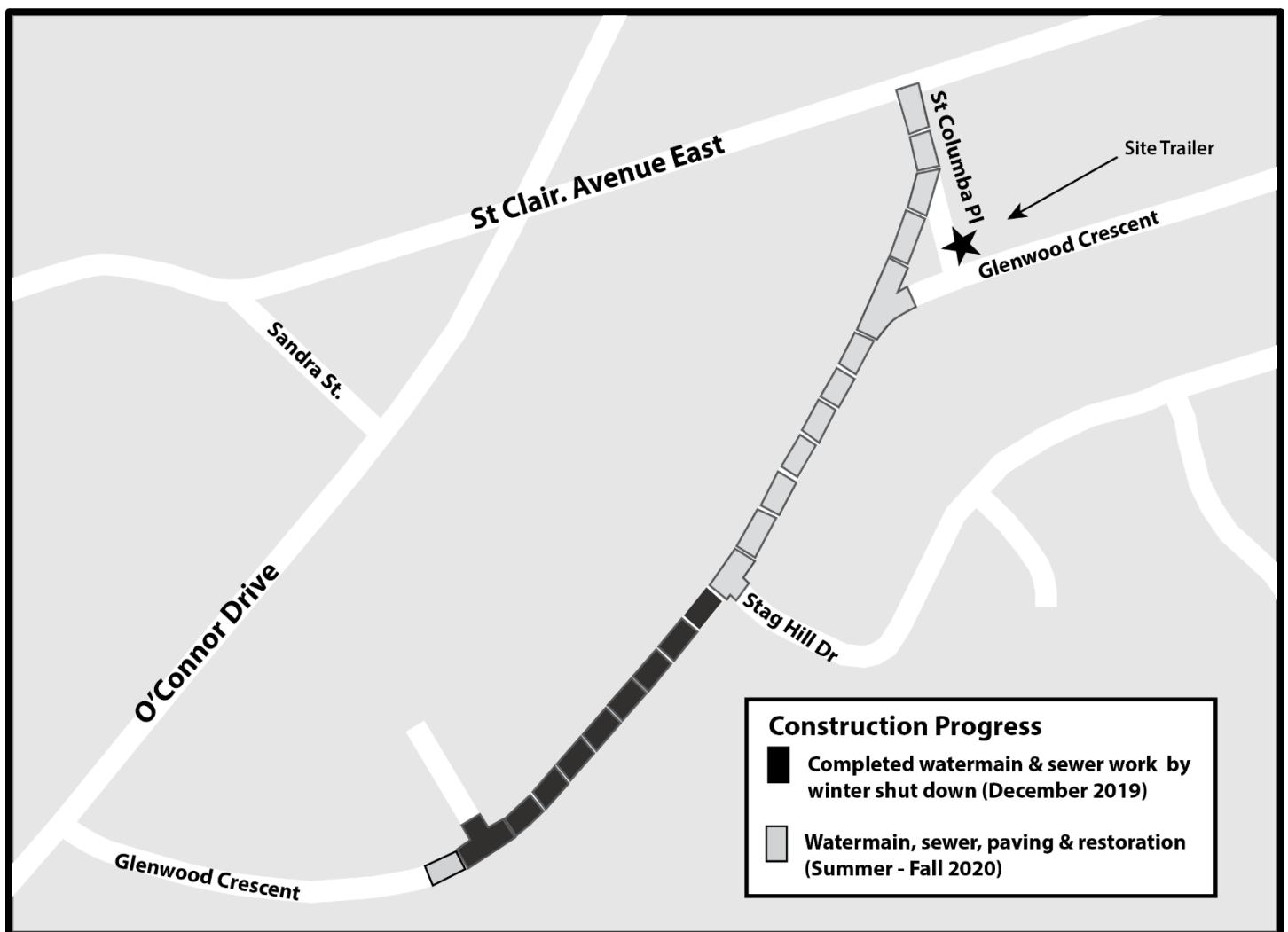
**Enbridge:**

**Please Note:** Enbridge Gas is still completing gas loop work in the area. For Enbridge to complete the gas loop connection they are reliant on the customer accepting the service disruption and allowing access to the house. Homes that are impacted by this work will be communicated with ahead of time to allow homeowners and Enbridge to arrange a time for relight.
