Contract: 20ECS-TI-10SP Start Date: September 21, 2020 End Date: October 25, 2020 *Timeline is subject to change.


The City of Toronto will resurface the road on Gerrard Street West from Yonge Street to Elizabeth Street. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs resurfacing and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

As restrictions on construction have been lifted by the Province of Ontario, City-led infrastructure will continue to proceed. During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. MAP OF WORK AREA




WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Remove top asphalt and make concrete repairs
- Repair curbs, gutters and driveways
- Reduce curb radii at La Plante Ave
- Replace areas of sidewalk and install tactile plates at some intersections
- Repave the road surface

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work on weekends as required. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.

÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Traffic on Gerrard Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction.
	Bicycles and cars will travel single-file through the construction zone.
\mathbb{R}	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Public Consultation Unit to arrange for access during the construction period.
	Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <i>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</i>
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
