Sanitary Sewer Chamber Rehabilitation on Market Street near the Esplanade

Contract: 19ECS-MI-01SA

Start Date: Week of October 26, 2020 End Date: Thursday, December 3, 2020 *Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is rehabilitating the sewer chamber and replacing a section of sanitary sewer on Market Street near the Esplanade in order to address sewer capacity concerns and reduce the stormwater inflow to the sanitary system. This project is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program that will improve sanitary sewer system and the City's aging infrastructure.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO



WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Remove a portion of the pavers on Market Street to access, to replace the sanitary chamber and a
 portion of the sanitary sewer.
- Remove bollards on Market Street to allow for traffic, deliveries, and pick up at St. Lawrence Market
- Restore Market Street to its pre-construction condition

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
	Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with business owners and homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, exterior pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.
•••	Site Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there may be road and crosswalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will always be maintained.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. One lane of traffic on Market Street will be maintained for the entire project.
(\mathbb{R})	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location. There will be fewer spots on Market Street as a result of the work. Please park in nearby green P lots.
	Restoration: All areas affected by construction will be restored.
