## Emergency Bridge Closure Meadowvale Road bridge over Little Rouge River

As a result of a recent inspection, the City of Toronto has temporarily closed the Meadowvale Road bridge over Little Rouge River and will complete emergency repairs to ensure the bridge remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians.

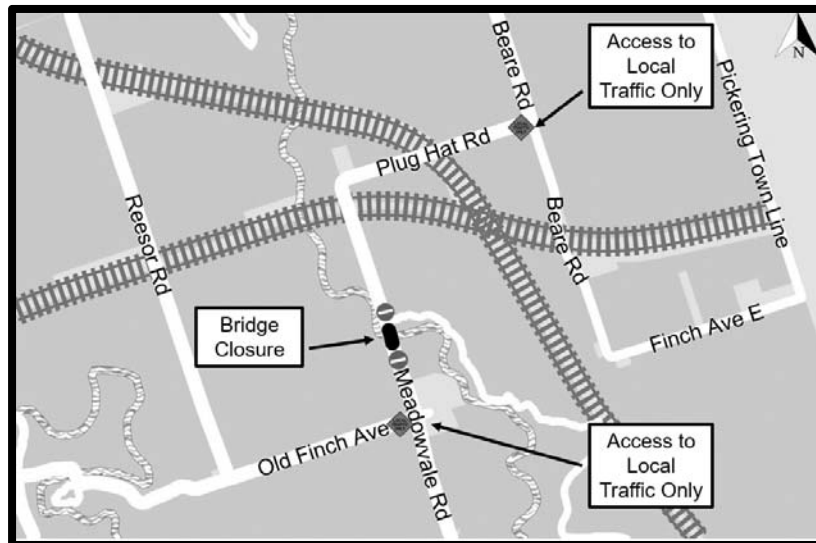
Meadowvale Road will need to be closed between Old Finch Avenue and Beare Road to non-local traffic and the bridge will be closed to all users.

We recognize that this type of work is disruptive and the City is making every effort to complete the work as quickly as possible. Your patience during this emergency work is appreciated.

### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

**Work Hours:** Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.

	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone.</p> <p><b>The bridge will be closed to all users.</b></p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p><b>Meadowvale Road be closed between Old Finch Avenue and Beare Road to non-local traffic.</b></p>
	<p><b>Site Safety:</b> Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area and regular two-way traffic will resume when work is complete.</p>
