Letter of Municipal Non-Objection for Temporary Physical Extension of Liquor Sales

At its meeting on June 29th, City Council authorized the General Manager, Transportation Services, when approving a sidewalk café, curb lane/parklet café or public parklet under the CaféTO program, to confirm that the City of Toronto does not object to the temporary physical extension of liquor sales under section 97(2) of regulation 719 under the Liquor Licence Act for that approved area and to withdraw this confirmation if the operator of a sidewalk café, curb lane/parklet café or public parklet, in the opinion of the General Manager, subsequently fails to comply with the CaféTO program, applicable City by-laws or policies, or orders under the Reopening Ontario Act. At its meeting on October 27th, City Council extended this authority, for cafés on the sidewalk only, until April 14, 2021.

Item EX14.1 "CaféTO – Increasing Outdoor Dining Space For Toronto Restaurants and Bars" Item EX17.7 "Winter Patio Permissions"

This letter confirms that the City does not object to the temporary physical extension of liquor sales for sidewalk cafés in the City of Toronto provided that the café operator meets all requirements of the Winter CaféTO program, including the Guidebook and City of Toronto Municipal Code Chapter 742 (Sidewalk Cafés, Parklets and Marketing Displays).

This Letter of Municipal Non-Objection must be accompanied by a valid liquor licence issued by the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO). The operator must also abide by any conditions imposed on their establishment by either the AGCO or Community Council.

Please note that the City may withdraw this non-objection if you fail to comply with the CaféTO program, any applicable City by-laws or policies or orders under the Reopening Ontario Act.
