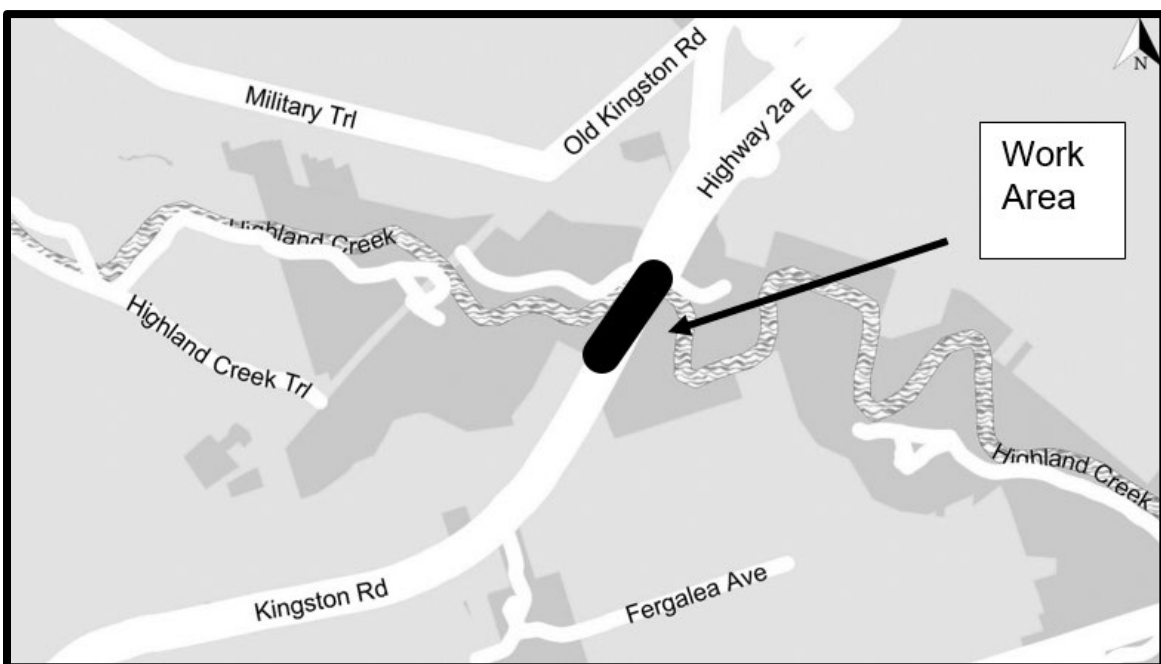
## Kingston Road Bridge Rehabilitation over Highland Creek

Contract: 20ECS-TI-01BE  
 Revised Start Date: October 19, 2020  
 Expected End Date: December 31, 2020  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

This notice provides an update on the Kingston Road bridge rehabilitation over Highland Creek.

Lane closures for the bridge expansion joint installation will begin over the weekend of December 4, 2020 (weather dependent) and are expected to last three weekends. During the weekend, work will begin at 8 p.m. on Fridays and end before 6 a.m. on Mondays. More information is available in the Work Details section of this Construction Notice Update.

### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Reconstruct the east embankment slope paving
- Install new abutment face drain on the east bridge abutments and strip joint seals at the bridge expansion joints

This work will take place in stages:

Stage/Area	Traffic Management
<b>Stage 1 South (weekend of December 4 or December 11)</b> Crews will remove and replace the expansion joint seal in the eastbound curb lane of the south structure	The eastbound curb lane and sidewalk on the south structure will be closed. Two other lanes on the south structure and all lanes and sidewalk on the north structure will remain open.
<b>Stage 2 South (weekend of December 4 or December 11)</b> Crews will remove and replace the bridge expansion joint seal in the eastbound middle and leftmost lanes of the south structure	Work on the south structures will take place with the eastbound leftmost and middle lanes on the south structure closed. The eastbound curb lane on the south structure (eastbound) and all three lanes on north structure (westbound) will remain open.
<b>Stage 1 North (weekend of December 11 or December 18)</b> Crews will remove and replace the expansion joint seal in the westbound curb lane and on the sidewalk of the north structure	The westbound curb lane and sidewalk on the north structure will be closed. Two other lanes on the north structure and all lanes and sidewalk on the south structure will remain open. Access entrance/exit from Military Trail, Watson Street, Morrish Road, and Kingston Road into Highway 2A will be closed. Traffic will be directed to Highway 2A through Highland Creek Overpass.






	The two left lanes on north structure and all three lanes on south structure will remain open.
<b>Stage 2 North (weekend of December 11 or December 18)</b> Crews will remove and replace the bridge expansion joint seal in the westbound middle lane of the north structure	Work the north structure will take place with the westbound middle lane on the north structure closed.  The westbound curb lane and leftmost lanes on the north structure and all eastbound lanes on the south structure will remain open.
<b>Stage 3 North (weekend of December 11 or December 18)</b> Crews will remove and replace the bridge expansion joint seal in the westbound leftmost lane of the north structure	The westbound leftmost lane on the north structure will be closed.  Two other lanes on the north structure and all lanes on the south structure will remain open.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. ## WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<b>24/7 Work Hours:</b> Work under the bridge will take place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week and on statutory holidays.  Work on the bridge deck will begin at 8 p.m. on Fridays and end before 6 a.m. on Mondays.
	<b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.  Intermittent sidewalk closure will be required for removal and installation of strip seals at the bridge expansion joints. Site signage will direct pedestrians where to safely cross the road on either side of the bridge, and site notices will inform pedestrians of sidewalk accessibility.
	<b>Parks and Trails:</b> Due to the nature of this work areas of Colonel Danforth Park will be affected. Sections of the trail under the bridge will be closed to the public for the duration of the project so that crews can remove and reconstruct the concrete slope paving. Signs will be posted. All areas of the park and trail affected by construction will be restored.
	<b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, clear sidewalk path, etc.) must contact the <b>Project Engineer</b> to arrange for access during the construction period.
	<b>TTC Service:</b> Travel times on the <b>86 Scarborough</b> bus may be affected.  Visit <a href="https://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for accurate schedule information.
