

Park improvements are on the way to Robertson Davies Park through the Section 37 required by the new residential development at 281 Avenue Road.












VARIETY OF SHRUB BEDS WITH YEAR-ROUND INTEREST AND EVERGREEN FOCUS



Community Engagement



Community mail outs and park signage advertising the upcoming Virtual Public Meeting and Online Survey were sent to residents and posted in the current park.

Community Outreach and Engagement

January 2020

Project webpage went live, physical postcards and digital eflyer sent out to purchasers and community residents notifying them of the upcoming virtual public meeting and online survey

February 10th, 2021

Virtual Public Information Meeting hosted by PFR

Early Survey Results



Survey closes on Friday, February 26th

Available now at Toronto.ca/RobertsonDaviesPark

Received 59 respondents from community members so far!

What We've Heard (so far)

- 63% of respondents identified that they were satisfied or very satisfied with the proposed improvements
- Of the featured improvements proposed, respondents liked:
 - Ornamental tree planting (79%)
 - New accessible pathway (60%)
 - New LED lighting for the park (58%)
- **Suggestions for improvements included:**
 - Extension of the wrought iron fence on Avenue Road
 - Connecting the existing pathway via the curve shown, but not through a straight path going south
 - More trees and planting on the south side of the park, preservation of Ginkgo trees on Avenue Road
 - Placement of the water fountain near Avenue Road or near park benches
 - Addition of outdoor fitness equipment, bike parking
 - Signage to encourage dog-owners to visit nearby Ramsden Park and other neighbourhood OLAs
