DECISION:

The Tribunal approved the joint Proposed Resolution, originally signed on February 8, 2021, as follows:

“The business licences Licence No. B50-4865394 (a Retail Store (Food) Licence) and Licence No. B71-4979414 (an Eating Establishment Licence) will be renewed, and the Eating Establishment Licence (pursuant to Application No. C008767) will be issued effective immediately (collectively, the “**Licences**”), subject to the following conditions:

- (1) All fees, documents and/or any outstanding requirements must be submitted to the satisfaction of Municipal Licensing and Standards within 30 days of the Tribunal hearing, failing which the Licences may be cancelled;

- (2) The Licences will be placed on probation for a period of two (2) years. The Licensees are advised that during the probationary period, MLS may make additional checks of any criminal, and by-law charges and convictions against the Licensees and its directors and officers, and conduct other investigations, as appropriate, to assess The Licensees' compliance with the requirements of Chapter 545 of the Municipal Code and other applicable laws;
- (3) During the probationary period, if Municipal Licensing and Standards has concerns with any new charges or convictions against the Licensees, their directors and/or officers, or any other concerns with respect to the conduct of the Licensees, their directors and/or officers, those matters and report no. 7434 and any updating material, may be brought back before the Tribunal for a full hearing."
