## Road Resurfacing on Church Street from Gloucester Street to Park Road

**Contract: 20ECS-TI-10SP**

**Start Date: March 8, 2021 End Date: June 20, 2021**

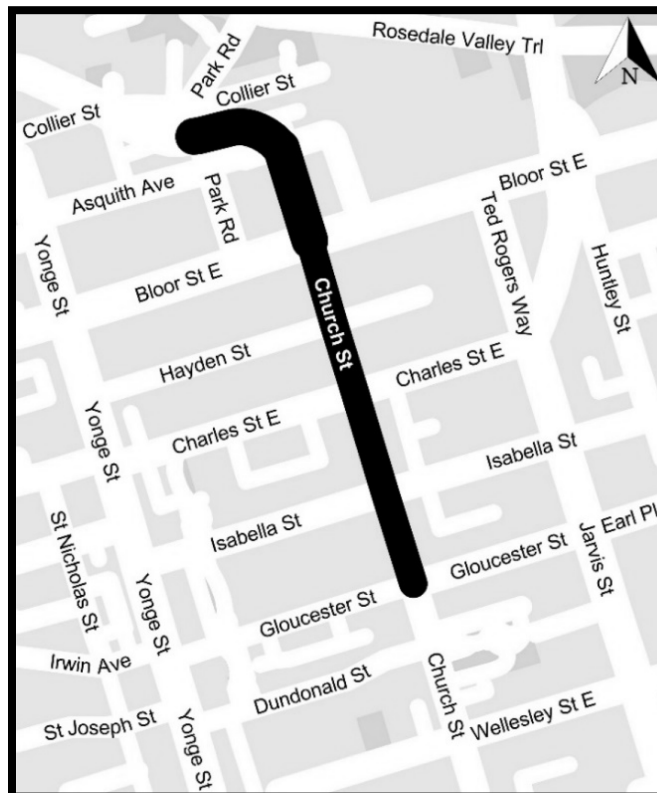
The City of Toronto will resurface Church Street from Gloucester Street to Park Road. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaving and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. Crews will also remove old streetcar tracks under the road surface, south of Bloor Street East.

This work is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

During construction, the contractor is responsible for the Health & Safety on site under the Ontario Occupational Health and Safety Act and is expected to implement COVID-19 mitigation practices. ### MAP OF WORK AREA










Park Road to Gloucester Street <b>March 8 to June 20</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Repair curbs, gutters and driveways</li> <li>• Replace areas of sidewalk and install tactile plates at intersections</li> <li>• Curb radii reduction at some intersections</li> <li>• Restore special crosswalk treatments on Isabella and Hayden Streets</li> <li>• Install new traffic signage on Charles and Isabella</li> <li>• Repave the road surface</li> <li>• Civil works for a future traffic signal at Church and Gloucester</li> </ul>	One lane of traffic in each direction
Bloor Street East to Gloucester Street <b>April 5 to May 10</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Remove old streetcar tracks under the road surface</li> <li>• Reconstruct the road base</li> </ul>	One lane of southbound traffic only

	<b>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 11 p.m., Monday to Friday,</b> with work on weekends as required. Excavation activities and heavy breaking will occur between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m.
	<b>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features.</b> Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.  This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the <b>Public Consultation Unit</b> listed below.

	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p><b>Driveway Access:</b> The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p><i>Please note: No construction work will occur in the intersection of Church Street and Bloor Street East</i></p> <p><b>Traffic on Church Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction.</b></p> <p><b>From April 5 to May 10, traffic on Church Street will be reduced to one southbound lane from Bloor Street East to Gloucester Street.</b></p>
	<p><b>Site Safety:</b> Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.</p>
	<p><b>Physical Distancing:</b> There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p><b>Parking:</b> This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>
	<p><b>Parking Violation Notice:</b> If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on the Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number.</li> </ol>

	<p>2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the back of the parking violation notice.</p> <p><b>You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Please note:</b> violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).</p> <p>In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction and may need to temporarily park on your street.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the <b>Public Consultation Unit</b> to arrange for access during the construction period.</p>
	<p><b>Garbage and Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. <b>Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.</b></p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.</p>
