



From concrete to living garden, the Toronto City Hall podium roof, where visiting dignitaries were once welcomed at the “front door” of the Council Chambers, is now a public green roof garden. Approximately 3,250 m<sup>2</sup> (35,000 square feet) of concrete on the podium roof has been transformed into living vegetation to reduce the building’s environmental impact and for residents and visitors to enjoy all year around.



## City Hall 100 Queen Street West

Toronto City Hall is the seat of municipal government and corporate head office for Canada’s largest city. It consists of two office towers. The East Tower has 27 floors; the West Tower, 20 floors. Nestled between the two towers is the Council Chamber where Toronto City Council holds its monthly meetings. The remainder of the public areas at City Hall are located on the first and second floors. The offices of the Mayor and the 25 City Councillors are on the second floor. The upper floors of the two towers contain office space for City staff, who provide a wide variety of municipal services to the people of Toronto.

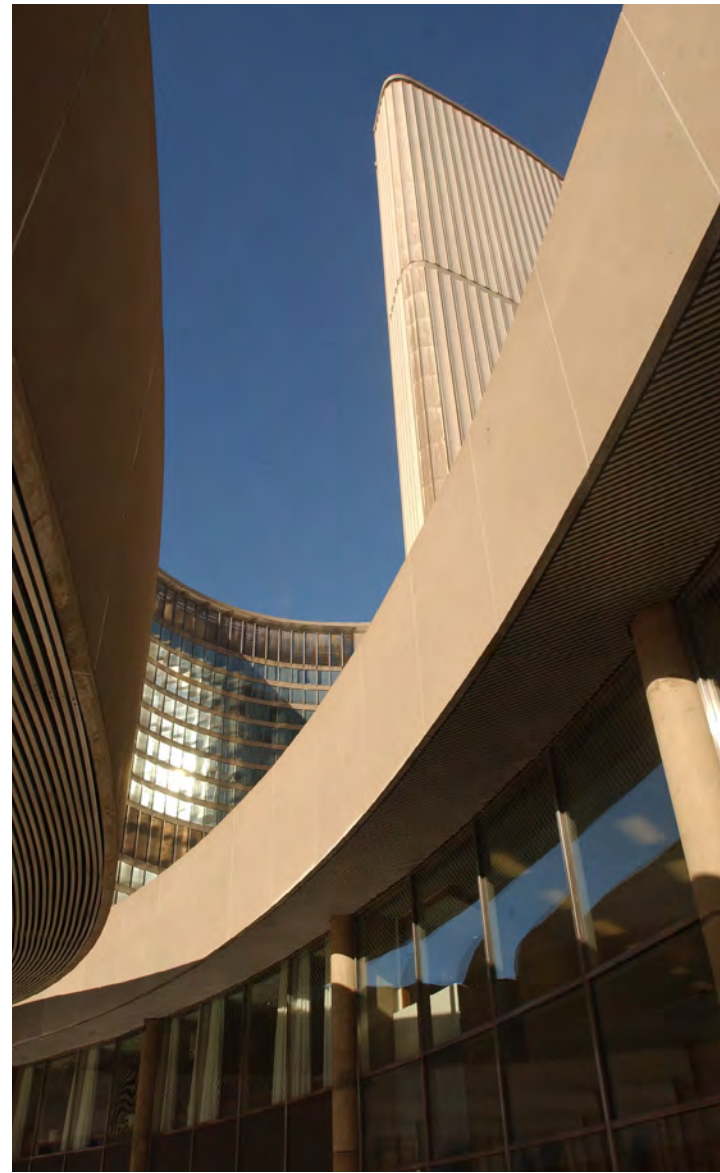
