# Road Resurfacing on Kidron Valley Drive from Kipling Avenue to Gihon Spring Drive

Contract: 20ECS-TI-16MR Start Date: May 2021 End Date: November 2021 \*Timeline is subject to change.


The City of Toronto is planning to resurface Kidron Valley Drive from Kipling Avenue to Gihon Spring Drive. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs repaying and sections of damaged curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program to renew aging City roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.



Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the **Project Manager** to arrange for access during the construction period.

# **Pre-Construction Notice**

역 () () () () () () () () () () () () ()	Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to the interior and exterior of your home to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a request to schedule a time to complete the pre- construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre- construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.
<b>N</b>	Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.
<u> </u>	This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated
