In October 2020, the City started construction at the intersection of Mount Pleasant Road and Roxborough Drive.

This spring, traffic signal components will be installed and line painting will be completed. The work is expected to take two to three weeks to complete.

WORK DETAILS

In fall 2020, the City's contractor:

- Re-aligned catch basins and adjusted maintenance holes;
- Reconstructed sidewalk, curb and gutters;

- Repaved the road surface and trail; and
- Placed topsoil and new sod.

- In spring 2021, the City's contractor will:
- Install the traffic signal;
- Complete new line painting; and
- Install "new traffic light" signage.
