Don River Boulevard Bridge Superstructure Replacement over West Don River

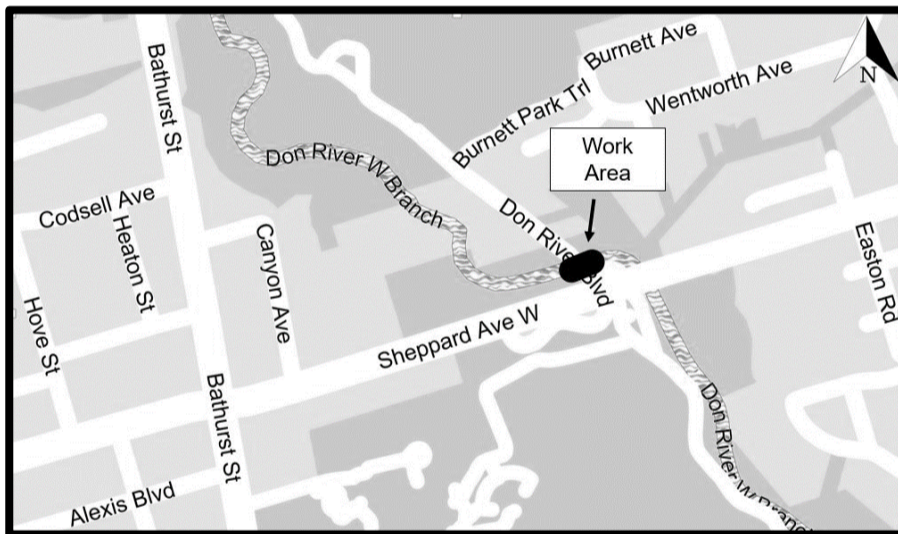

The City of Toronto is replacing the superstructure of the Don River Boulevard Bridge over West Don River. The work will involve replacing the bridge deck and girders and repairing the bridge abutments. The railings will also be replaced to current City standards. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

WORK DETAILS





The City's contractor will:

- Replace the existing superstructure, including bridge deck and girders on Don River Boulevard Bridge over West Don River
- Replace the existing railings and concrete sidewalks
- Perform concrete removal and repair for substructure, including the top portions of abutments, ballast walls and top portions of wingwalls for both north and south substructure
- Replace bridge bearings
- Replace the asphalt surface and waterproofing
- Remove existing speed bump and pour new concrete bridge approach slabs at approaches

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>

	<p>The bridge reconstruction will be performed in two stages. The first stage will involve closing the northbound lane of Don River Boulevard at the bridge and the east sidewalk. The second stage will involve closing the southbound lane of Don River Boulevard at the bridge and the west sidewalk. There will be flaggers at each end of the bridge to facilitate traffic for construction vehicles.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Traffic on the Don River Boulevard Bridge will be reduced to one lane, with yield to oncoming traffic signs posted at each end of the bridge.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
