Scarborough Transmission Watermain Construction from Fishleigh Drive to Midland Avenue

The City of Toronto's work to install a new transmission watermain in your area is progressing.

PROGRESS UPDATE

Completed Work:





- Constructed the tunnel shafts at the Scarborough Pumping Station located on Fishleigh Drive (shaft 1), at southeast corner of Kingston Road and Glen Everest Road (shaft 2), at 2121 Kingston Road (shaft 3), at GO station parking lot (shaft 4) and at northwest corner of Midland Avenue and St. Clair Avenue East (shaft 5).
- Completed tunneling and installed watermain between shafts 1 to 2, shafts 2 to 3 and shafts 4 to 5.
- Installed the transmission watermain on St. Clair Avenue East from Midland Avenue to shaft 5, within the GO station parking lot from shaft 4 to Natal Park and through Natal Park to Aylesworth Avenue.
- Installed the transmission watermain on Clarendon Avenue from Aylesworth Avenue to Kingston Road and on Kingston Road from Clarendon Avenue to 2121 Kingston Road.
- Replaced the local watermain and substandard water services on Clarendon Avenue from Aylesworth Avenue to McIntosh Street.
- Restored the Scarborough GO station parking lot. Replaced the damaged sidewalks, curbs and completed the base asphalt on Clarendon Avenue, Kingston Road and St. Clair Avenue.
- Restored shafts 4 and 5.

Remaining Work:

- Install transmission watermain on Midland Avenue from St. Clair Avenue East to about 100m north, connect to the existing watermain and restore the area.
- Install transmission watermain within the Scarborough Pumping Station, connect to the existing watermains and restore the area.
- Road restoration on Midland Avenue, St. Clair Avenue, Clarendon Avenue and Kingston Road.
- Restore Shafts 2 and 3.
- Restore Natal Park and laydown areas within the Scarborough GO station.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p>Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p>

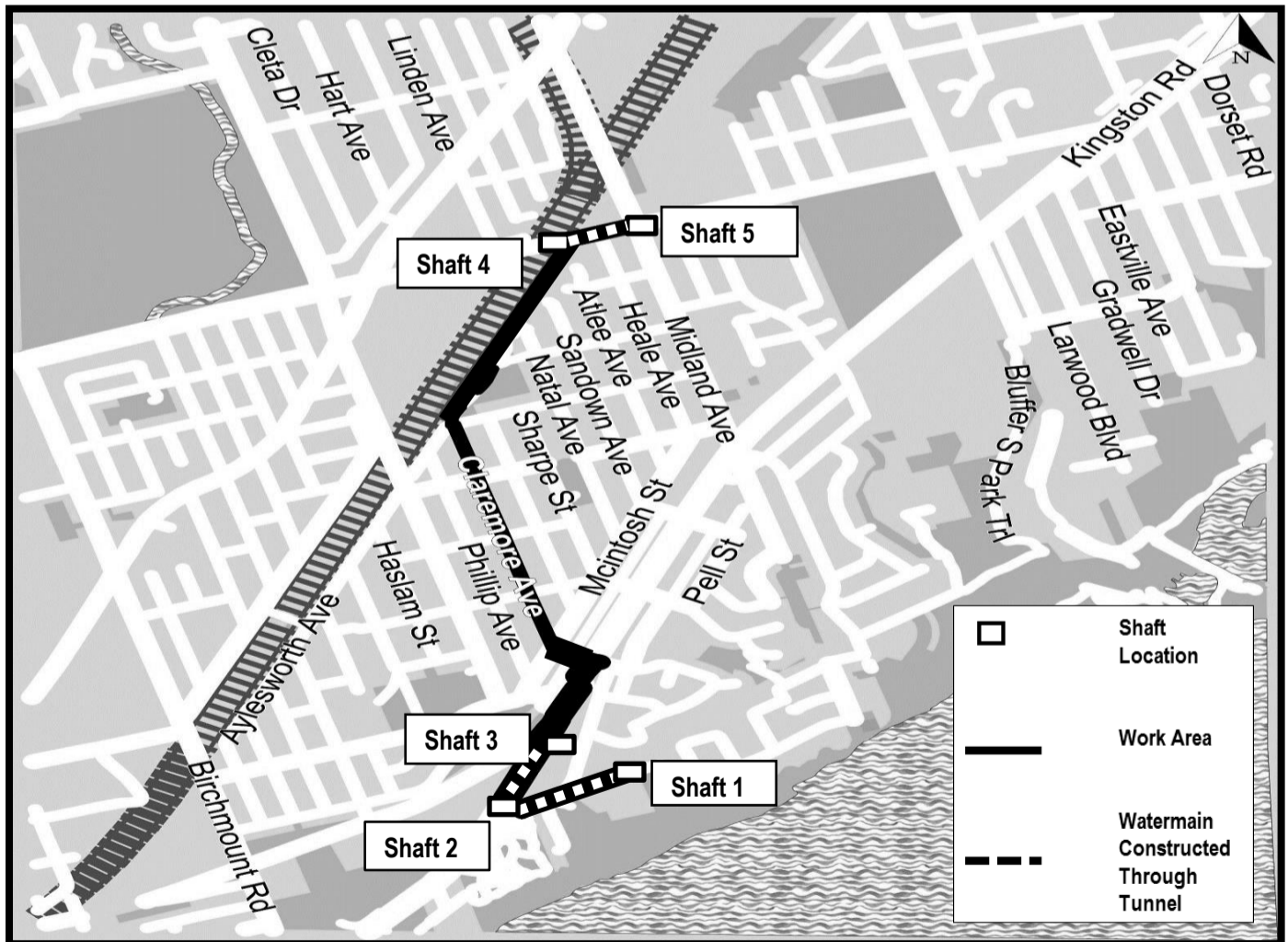
	<p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p> <p>Traffic on southbound Midland Avenue will be reduced to one lane.</p>
	<p>Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone or similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons, in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
