# Mill Street Bridge Rehabilitation over West Don River

#### Contract: 21ECS-TI-11BE Start Date: June 2021 End Date: December 2021 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Mill Street Bridge over West Don River starting in June 2021. The rehabilitation will involve removal of asphalt and waterproofing, concrete overlay of the bridge deck followed by new waterproofing and paving. The existing railing will be replaced with a concrete parapet wall and railing system.

This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program.

### WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
