Thorncliffe Park Drive Bike Lane Reconfiguration

Start Date: July 2021 End Date: July 2021

**Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto will be reconfiguring the bike lane along Thorncliffe Park Drive, south of Overlea Boulevard.

Based on the feedback from the community and local City Councillor, Transportation Services has designed a reconfiguration of the bike lanes on Thorncliffe Park Drive to accommodate additional parking spaces without compromising safety. The new design includes 30 new parking spaces in addition to the 10 existing spaces, for a total of 40 spaces, shown in the map below.

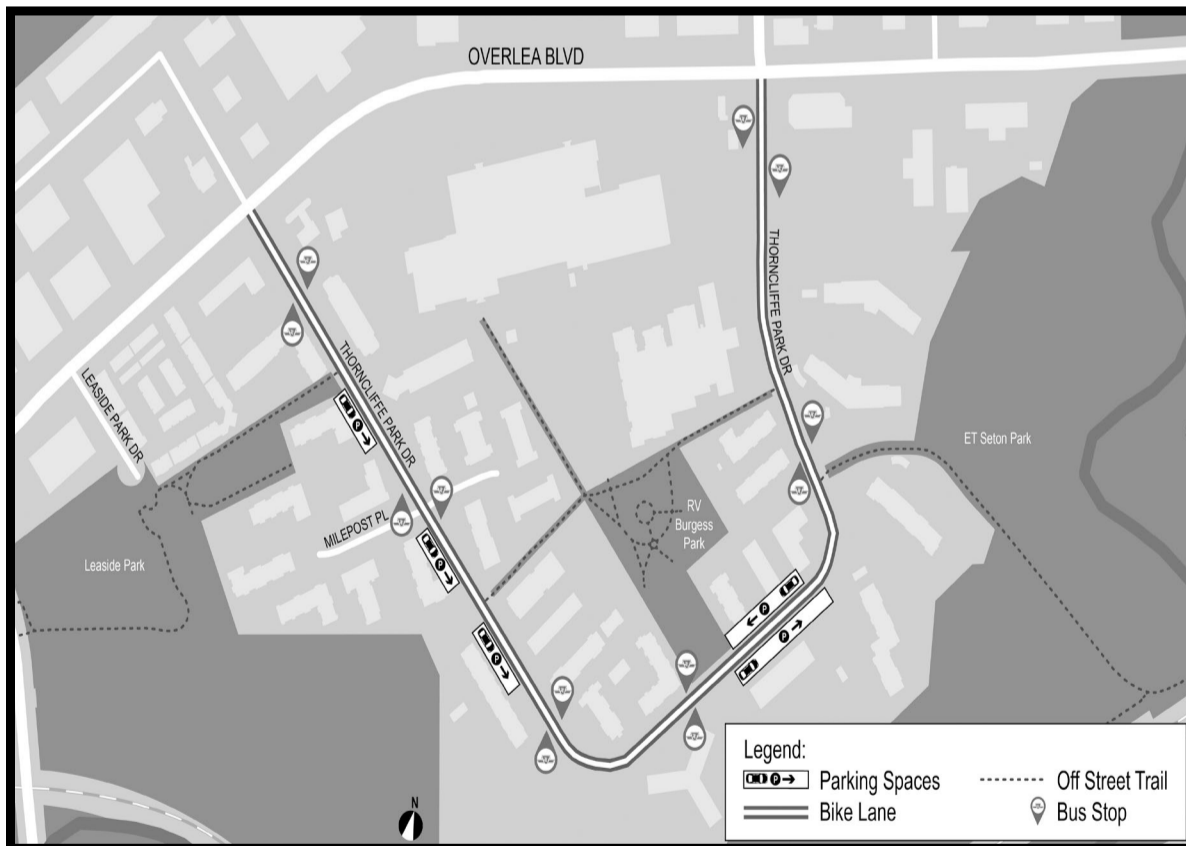
Additionally, the TTC will be removing one pair of the current 14 bus stops in order to reduce the close spacing of stops and enhance bus reliability.

Physical separation will be added in the buffer between people cycling and driving.

MAP OF WORK AREA










WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Make changes to roadway markings
- Change signage to show where parking is allowed
- Install concrete curbs and flex bollards to separate people cycling from vehicles

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Work Hours: Pavement markings will be installed overnight and all other work will happen during the daytime. Noisy work will be limited to daytime hours as much as possible.</p>
	<p>Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect only minor delays and increased traffic. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars may be sharing the lane during construction. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.</p>
	<p>Site Safety: Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.</p>
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p>Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the Project Manager listed below.</p>
