# Dufferin Street at Dupont Street Bridge Rehabilitation


Contract: 21ECS-TI-03BE Start Date: July 5<sup>th</sup> 2021 End Date: February 2022 \*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto is planning to rehabilitate the Dufferin Street Bridge under the Canadian Pacific Railway (CP Rail) at Dupont Street. This work will ensure that the bridge meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

#### **WORK DETAILS**

The City's contractor will:

- Patch repair existing abutment walls, wingwalls, retaining walls and pier
- Reconstruct concrete elevated sidewalks and slab on grade
- Replace pedestrian railings
- Install crash protection at piers
- Replace bridge lighting

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

 You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

$\bigcirc$	<b>Work Hours</b> : Work will take place from 7 a.m.to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday; 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturdays. No work will occur on Sundays and Statutory holidays.
4	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	At least one sidewalk will remain open at all times. Temporary signage will direct pedestrians to safely cross the bridge.
#	<b>Traffic Management</b> : Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.
	The traffic management plan is shown in the table on Page one (1) of this Construction Notice.
	<b>Site Safety:</b> Workers on site are responsible for the work assigned to them. If you have construction questions or an issue on site – ask to be directed to the site inspector. If the site inspector is unavailable, contact the person listed at the end of this notice.
Ė	Accessible Accommodation: Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) must contact the Field Ambassador to arrange for access during the construction period.
<b>.</b> :	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced.
