#### Cricket Reference Group - Terms of Reference

The purpose of these Terms of Reference (TOR) is to define the Cricket Reference Group's role and responsibilities, its authority, its membership and meeting procedures.

#### 1. Mandate

The Cricket Reference Group (CRG) will aim to provide perspective, guidance and expert advice to the City of Toronto Parks, Forestry & Recreation (PFR) Division on **building organizational** capacity and increasing access to community cricket programs and facilities<sup>1</sup> across the city. This non-political advisory body will inform the development of the City's <u>Cricket Strategy</u>.

The CRG is accountable to represent and serve the needs of cricket players and organizations in Toronto.


