Baywood Road Culvert Replacement over Humber River Tributary

Contract: 21ECS-TI-13BE Start Date: June 28, 2021 End Date: March 12, 2022 *Timeline is subject to change.


The City of Toronto will replace the culvert at Baywood Road over the Humber River Tributary. This work will ensure that the culvert meets today's standards and remains safe for vehicles and pedestrians into the future. The project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program.

Due to the nature of this project, the City will have to remove some of the trees and shrubs within the ravine directly east and west of Baywood Road starting the first week of August. Trees in the removal area will be replaced with a 3:1 ratio of naturalization planting including tree whips and shrubs and will be overseen by the City's Parks, Recreation & Forestry Division.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO

WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- Replace the Baywood Road culvert over the Humber River Tributary
- Construct new armour stone retaining walls at the inlet and outlet of the new culvert and restore the channel in the immediate vicinity of the culvert
- Replace the sidewalk, asphalt, curbs, guiderail, and railing in the immediate vicinity of the culvert
- Undertake work on behalf of Bell to upgrade infrastructure

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

• You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	Work Hours : Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.
÷	Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.
	Access to driveways along Baywood Road in close proximity to the project will be maintained during the work, but may be impacted during concrete sidewalk

	One sidewalk or walkway along Baywood Road will be maintained to pedestrians at all times.
8	Traffic Management : Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.
	Physical Distancing
	There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.
шш	Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.
\mathbf{R}	Parking: Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. This project will affect on-street parking. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.
	 Parking Violation Notice: In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, the City encourages communities with construction to be patient as neighbours may need to temporarily relocate vehicles. If enforcement is called, enforcement must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket). If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date: 1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on the Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number. 2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the reverse side of the parking violation notice. You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Please note: violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).
Ŀ	Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and that entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please inform the contact listed below.
	Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
