## Overnight Installation of Temporary Traffic Controls on Scarlett Road

**Contract: 21ECS-TI-14BE**  
**Contract Start Date: July 19, 2021 Contract End Date: May 22, 2022**  
*\*Timeline is subject to change.*

The City of Toronto's work to replace the culvert at Scarlett Road over Humber Creek is progressing well. This notice is to provide an update on the installation of the temporary traffic controls for phase 1 of work on the culvert.

The installation is being done at night to allow workers to complete the temporary pavement markings and installation safely, with minimal disruption.

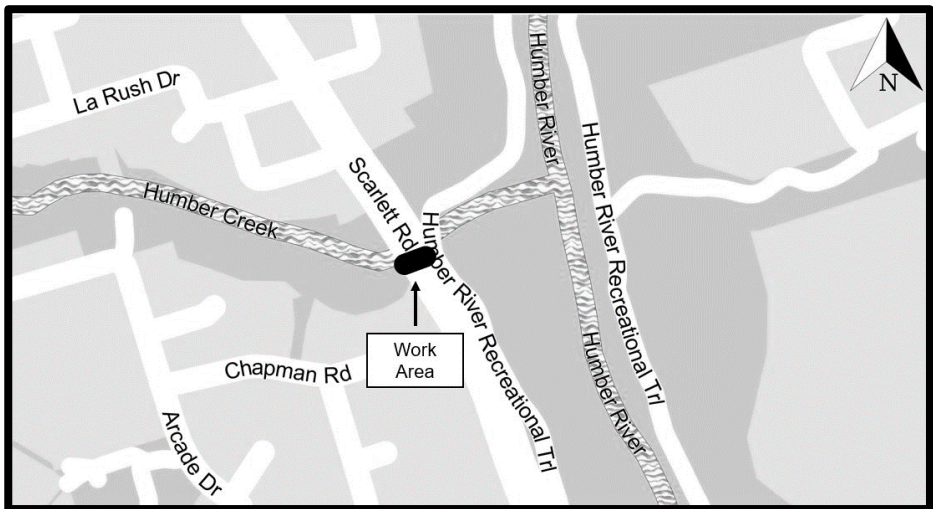
On **Monday, July 26, Tuesday, July 27 and Wednesday, July 28, from 8 p.m. to 6 a.m.**, the contractor will remove and install pavement line markings and installation of temporary concrete barriers. The work will generate different noises than what usually occurs, but will not go over the noise by-law restrictions for the area. The contractor is permitted to work 24 hours a day until the work can be completed and the roadway open to traffic; however, a minimum of one lane in each direction will always be maintained.

Your patience and understanding is appreciated during this disruption. Thank you for your patience during this overnight work.

### WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will at night:








- Remove line markings on the road and install temporary line marking for the stage 1 traffic control
- Install temporary concrete barrier walls that are bolted to the road

<b>Phase 2</b> Construct west half of culvert:	October 2021 to November 2021

## WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. We appreciate your patience.

	<p><b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, and 9 a.m. to 7 p.m., Saturday, with work after hours and on Sunday as required.</p>
	<p><b>Road and Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.</p> <p>Access to driveways along Scarlett Road in close proximity to the project will be maintained during the work, but may be impacted during concrete sidewalk construction and/or asphalt paving activities. Residents impacted by this will receive additional notice prior to the work.</p> <p>One sidewalk along Scarlett Road will be maintained to pedestrians at all times. Signalized pedestrian cross-walks will be maintained at Edenbridge Drive and East Drive.</p>
	<p><b>Traffic Management:</b> Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.</p> <p>The traffic management plan is shown in a table on page one of this Construction Notice.</p>
	<p><b>Physical Distancing</b></p> <p>There are times when contractors need to communicate with residents about the work happening nearby. Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing.</p> <p>Where possible, a phone number for a contact person on-site will be provided on notices, to answer questions about work near your property. At other times, the contractor may knock on your door, but will then step away the required distance to discuss the work that is taking place and what can be expected that day. Please practice physical distancing with workers so everyone can remain safe. If you have questions, call the contact provided on this notice.</p>
	<p><b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and that entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, please inform the contact listed below.</p>
	<p><b>TTC Impacts:</b> TTC stops along Scarlett Road may be impacted during the work. Signage will direct bus users to temporary bus stop locations. Visit <a href="http://ttc.ca">ttc.ca</a> for accurate schedule information.</p>
	<p><b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).</p>
