# Watermain Replacement on Bloor Street West from Spadina Avenue to Avenue Road

Contract: 20ECS-LU-19SU
Start Date: Early February, 2021
End Date: July 2021
\*Timeline is subject to change.

During the week of April 5<sup>th</sup>, the contractor will be installing large diameter water services and watermain street connections at multiple locations along Bloor Street West between Spadina Avenue to Avenue Road. Water service connection work will be done at the intersections and side streets between Spadina Avenue and Avenue Road.

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT COVID-19 AND CONSTRUCTION WORK IN TORONTO



#### DEVONSHIRE ROAD CLOSURE SATURDAY APRIL 3rd

Unrelated to the City watermain installation work, The University of Toronto will be removing the outdoor bubble facility currently situated at Varsity Stadium on Saturday April 3<sup>rd</sup>. This work will require a day-long closure of Devonshire PI as a crane will be moving parts off the field and loading it onto transport trucks.

#### WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

You will experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce local impacts. Your patience is appreciated.



**Work Hours**: Work will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday to Saturday, with work after hours, overnight and on weekends as required.



**Traffic Management:** Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should continue to obey all posted traffic signage.

Devonshire Place will be closed to vehicle traffic on Saturday April 3<sup>rd</sup>



**Road and Sidewalk Access:** In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.



**Driveway Access:** The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.



**Alternate Cycle Routes:** During construction the bike lane(s) will be temporarily removed through the work zone. Signs for cyclists will be posted directing them to share the one lane of eastbound and westbound traffic lanes through the work zone. Cyclists should consider Harbord Street as alternative routes during construction.



**Accommodation:** Residents that require accommodation are advised to contact the Public Consultation Staff listed below to arrange for access during construction.
