Road Reconstruction on Attwell Drive from Disco Road to Carlingview Drive

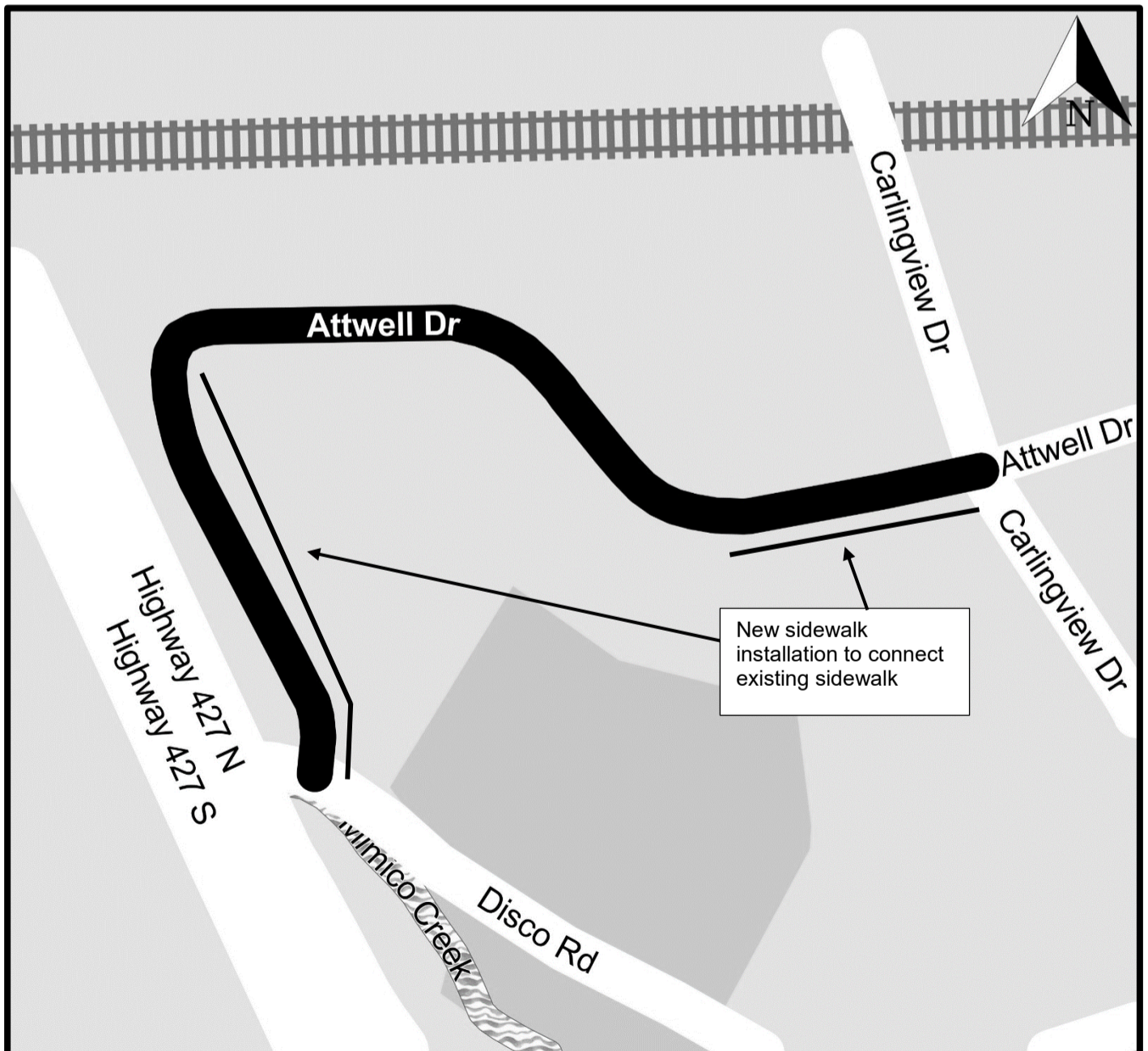
The City of Toronto is planning to reconstruct Attwell Drive from Disco Road to Carlingview Drive. Our inspection of the road shows that it needs reconstruction, and the curb and sidewalk need to be replaced to bring them to a state of good repair. The City is also planning to install a new sidewalk approximately between 396 and 452 Attwell Drive to connect to the existing sidewalk (see map). Sidewalks are a critical piece of transportation infrastructure which provide accessibility and safety for all, including vulnerable road users.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2020 Capital Works Program to renew aging city roads and sidewalk for current and future needs.

WHAT TO EXPECT BEFORE CONSTRUCTION

- Work crews will mark sidewalks and curbs requiring replacement and the locations of underground utilities, such as gas, water and cable so that the construction work does not interfere with these utilities.
- Affected properties will receive a Construction Notice approximately two weeks before work begins with more information about the work.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>Access to Your Home: The City-hired contractor may need access to the interior and exterior of your home to complete a pre-construction condition survey. Affected properties will receive a request to schedule a time to complete the pre-construction condition survey. Although participation is voluntary, the pre-construction survey results may be useful to confirm claims for potential damage caused by City construction.</p>
	<p>Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.</p> <p>This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the Project Manager listed below.</p>
	<p>City Owned Trees: Due to the nature of this project, the City may have to remove nine (9) street trees from the City's boulevard. If this affects a tree near your property, you will receive a separate notice. Trees in the removal area will be replaced with a 1:1 ratio of naturalization planting including tree whips and shrubs in a location determined and overseen by the City's Parks, Forestry & Recreation Division.</p>
	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <p>Traffic on Attwell Drive will be reduced to one lane in the work zone.</p>
	<p>During this project, Route 45B Kipling bus stops will be temporarily relocated in the work zone. Temporary signage will be posted at existing stops to guide TTC users.</p> <p>Visit: ttc.ca for accurate schedule information</p>
