This notice provides an update on the intersection improvements at Jane Street, Trethewey Drive and Denison Road East. The work on this project is currently on schedule.


The improvements are part of the Council-Approved 2019 budget and the City's Vision Zero Road Safety Plan that aims to create a safe and healthy city by eliminating all fatalities and serious injuries on city streets. WORK STATUS TO DATE

The City's contractor has:

- Completed a majority of electrical work for hydro poles
- Installed a majority of the new concrete road base
- Removed the northbound right turn channel on Jane Street and realigned the intersection

REMAINING WORK

The City's contractor still needs to complete:

- Permanent traffic signals at the intersection of Jane Street and Trethewey Drive
- Sections of concrete sidewalk
- Remaining sections of concrete road base
- The final top layer of asphalt paving
- Pavement markings and line paintings



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WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.




Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.



Traffic Management: Efforts have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents. Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets.

If overnight work is required, traffic on Jane Street will be reduced to one lane in each direction from 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM.



Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the construction work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions, however any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.
