The City of Toronto is working to improve safety and connectivity for people walking and cycling in the Keele St, Sheppard Ave W and Sentinel Rd area.


Construction of sidewalks, bike lanes and multi-use trails will take place from approximately September to December 2021 at the following intersections:

- Keele St at Dovehouse Ave
- Keele St at Sheppard Ave W
- Sheppard Ave W at Sentinel Rd to Sunfield Rd

Installation of pavement markings (paint on the roadway), including bike lanes and sharrows (shared bikeway) will take place on Sentinel Rd from Dovehouse Ave to Sheppard Ave W, and on Sunfield Dr between Sheppard Ave W and Diana Dr.

This project is part of the Council-approved 2021 Capital Works Program. The work in this area was considered and approved by Toronto City Council on June 26, 2018, after community consultation in February and March 2018. For more project background, visit http://toronto.ca/yorkudownsview


WORK DETAILS

The City's contractor will:

- · Dig up the road surface where required
- Mark the area where the new bikeways, trails, sidewalks and bus stops will be installed on City-owned land (Right-of way)
- Dig out the marked area
- Install granular base
- Form the area for new sidewalk bays, multi-use pathway
- Pour concrete and install tactile plates where required
- Install traffic signal equipment
- Repair curbs, gutters and driveway
- Remove forms
- Install a new road base and base asphalt where required
- Pave the road surface

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences. The City will make efforts to reduce the impacts. We appreciate your patience.
- The westbound bus shelter will be removed and the bus stops at the intersection of Eglinton and Jane will be temporarily relocated to allow for the construction activities.
- The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.





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restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.



Pre-Construction Inspection: GPM Environmental, under contract to the City of Toronto, will survey all properties within 30 metres of the construction area before construction starts. The inspection will look at the interior and exterior of all properties to verify existing conditions. Although participation is voluntary, the City encourages all homeowners to participate. Without the survey, it will be difficult to confirm any claims of damage caused by construction.

Affected properties will receive a separate notice to set up an appointment. All inspection staff will wear photo I.D. and carry photo equipment for this work.



Important information for owners of sprinkler systems / heated driveways and private landscaping features. Property owners should remove items located within City property limits (boulevard) to avoid damage.

This includes items such as landscaping (plants and pavers), decorative objects, sprinkler systems or heated driveways. If you have a sprinkler system or heated driveway, please contact the **Project Manager** listed below.





Telephone and Internet Services: This work may affect phone and internet cables for individual properties that aren't buried deep below the sidewalk. The contractor will coordinate with utility companies to minimize disruption. Residents who find their service has been disrupted should contact the **Project Manager** <u>and</u> notify their phone or internet service provider.



Road and Sidewalk Access: In order to complete the work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone. Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained at all times.

Driveway Access: The contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to your driveway access. If your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.



Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users.

Traffic on Sheppard Ave W and Keele St may be reduced to one lane.



Parking: This project will affect on-street parking. Parking in the active work zone is not permitted as space is needed for construction equipment and materials. If your parked vehicle affects construction work, it will be relocated with no charge to the owner. Please call 416-808-2222 for its location.



Parking Violation Notice: If parking enforcement is called to a street, officers must issue a yellow parking violation notice (ticket) to vehicles in violation of parking by-laws. If you receive a yellow notice during this construction work, do the following within 15 days of the notice date:

- 1) Contact the site inspector or person listed on the Construction Notice and give them the yellow notice number.
- 2) Dispute the parking violation notice online or in person following the process listed on the back of the parking violation notice.

You may use this construction notice as part of the explanation of why the violation should be cancelled. Please note: violation notices cannot be cancelled if vehicles are parked in illegal parking spots (i.e. in front of a fire hydrant or in no parking zones).

In an effort to reduce ticketing due to construction, please exercise patience with neighbours who are experiencing construction and may need to temporarily park on your street.



Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, contact the Project Manager listed below.



Garbage and Recycling: Please follow your normal routine. If required, the contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. *Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.*



Restoration: The construction work area will be restored with sod, concrete and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be replaced. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be done as needed during ideal growing seasons only - in the spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).
