Creating a Master Plan - Four Questions


- 1. How do we interpret the site's heritage?

- Flexibility to respond to evolving circumstances.







Natural History and Indigenous Presence - the historic shoreline








Composite Historical Layering




West Built-form - Low-rise Format






East Built-form - Mid-rise Format






East Built-form - Tower Format
