Sewer Connections & Creek Improvements in the East Don River – Phase 1: Tree Removals

Contract: #20ECS-MI-01DC Start Date: Mid-October, 2021 End Date: Summer 2023

*Timeline is subject to change.

The City of Toronto will start work to replace an undersized sewer, remove concrete weir and carry out channel improvements in the East Don River at 1240 Sheppard Avenue East.

Ahead of this construction work, trees located within the worksite will be cleared starting mid-October, 2021 and require approximately 4 weeks to complete. Residents will continue to be able to access this park around the worksite. (See map on page 2).

WORK DETAILS

Work will include:

- Removal of trees within the work zone
- Installation of Tree Protection Zones

	Work Hours: Work will take place between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on Saturdays as required. Email updates will be provided if extended hours are required.
	 Tree Removal: In order to remove the concrete weir, carry out channel improvements and install replacement sewer connections, trees within the work zone will need to be removed: 119 trees are planned to be removed, 253 trees to be preserved (in Tree Protection Zones) 85 trees will be monitored for minimal injury About 398 new trees will be replanted upon the completion of the project in late 2025
