Jane Street between Frith Road and Yewtree Boulevard

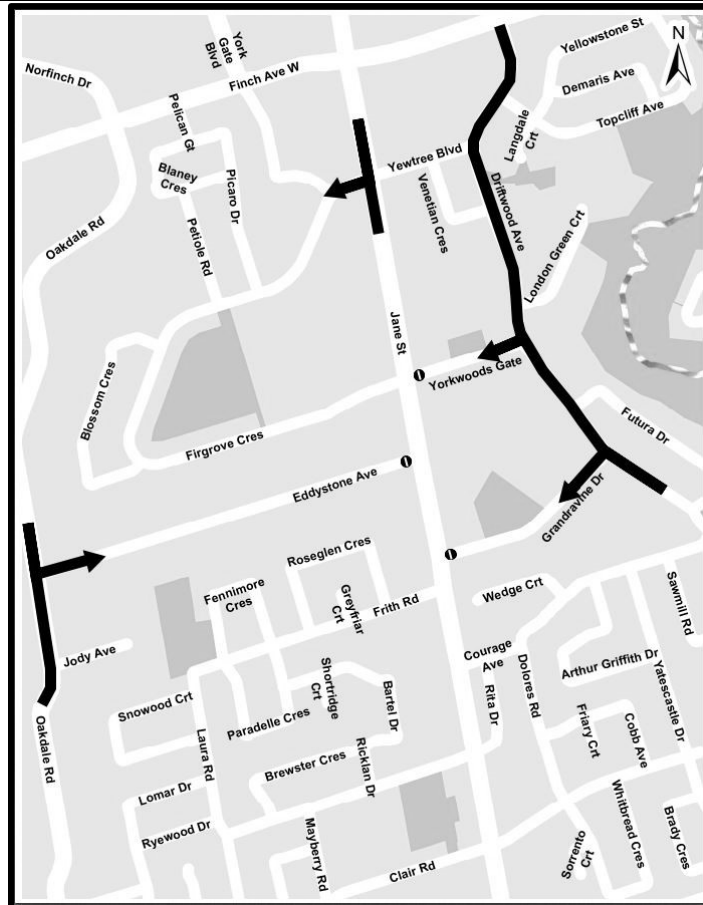

The City of Toronto is modifying and upgrading the storm, sewer and watermain system in your area in order to reduce surface and basement flooding, and improve the water distribution system.

WORK DETAILS

The contractor will close the intersections along Jane Street including Grandravine Drive, Eddystone Avenue and Yorkwoods Gate in order to remove and replace the existing asphalt on Jane Street where watermain and sewer works have been completed. Intersections will be reopened and made fully accessible over weekends with temporary ramping and/or sunken steel plates.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION

- The community will experience dust, noise and traffic delays.
- The City will make efforts to reduce impacts. Your patience is appreciated.

	<p>Traffic Management: Road users should expect delays and increased traffic on nearby main and side streets. Motorists are reminded that bicycles and cars will be sharing the lane. When driving, please be mindful of vulnerable road users. Efforts</p>
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	<p>have been made to manage traffic in the area for the safety of workers, road users and residents.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Traffic on Jane Street will be reduced to two lanes on the west side of the roadway. • The intersections at Jane Street and Grandravine Drive, and Jane Street and Yorkwoods Gate will be fully closed during the duration of the work. • There will also be no access to Eddystone Avenue or Firgrove Crescent for northbound traffic on Jane Street. Through traffic on Jane Street will still be able to travel north/south. • Yorkwoods Gate and Grandravine Drive can be accessed via Driftwood Avenue. • Eddystone Avenue can be accessed via Oakdale Road for motorists traveling southbound on Jane Street. • Firgrove Crescent will be accessible to motorists via Jane Street for southbound traffic or at the intersection of Yewtree Boulevard/Firgrove Crescent and Jane Street. • No properties will be blocked from access during construction procedures
	<p>Physical Distancing: There are times when contractors need to communicate with homeowners about what is happening on-site. This could be about driveway access, water shut offs, pre-construction inspections, and site restoration work (landscaping, installing pavers etc.). Contractor's staff will be identifiable by their high-visibility clothing and will maintain physical distancing.</p>
	<p>Pedestrians: The work may require temporary sidewalk restrictions; however, any necessary sidewalk closures will alternate in each direction to ensure pedestrian access is maintained during construction.</p>
	<p>Cyclists: Please share live traffic lanes with motorists on Jane Street. There will be no access to Yorkwoods Gate or Grandravine Drive through the intersection for cyclists on Jane Street. There will be limited access to Firgrove Crescent and Eddystone Avenue for cyclists traveling southbound only on Jane Street.</p>
	<p>Work Hours: Work will take place from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Monday to Friday, with work after hours and on weekends as required.</p> <p>Pending weather, the work should be completed in two weeks. The contractor will be working extended hours to minimize impact to traffic, pedestrians and public.</p>
	<p>Accessible Accommodation: The City's contractor must ensure safe and accessible walkways and entryways are maintained for everyone during construction. Any temporary access disruptions will be communicated as soon as possible. If you experience a disruption, have a specific access need or related accommodation request, inform the contact listed below.</p>
